Fashion Show Held At Tech

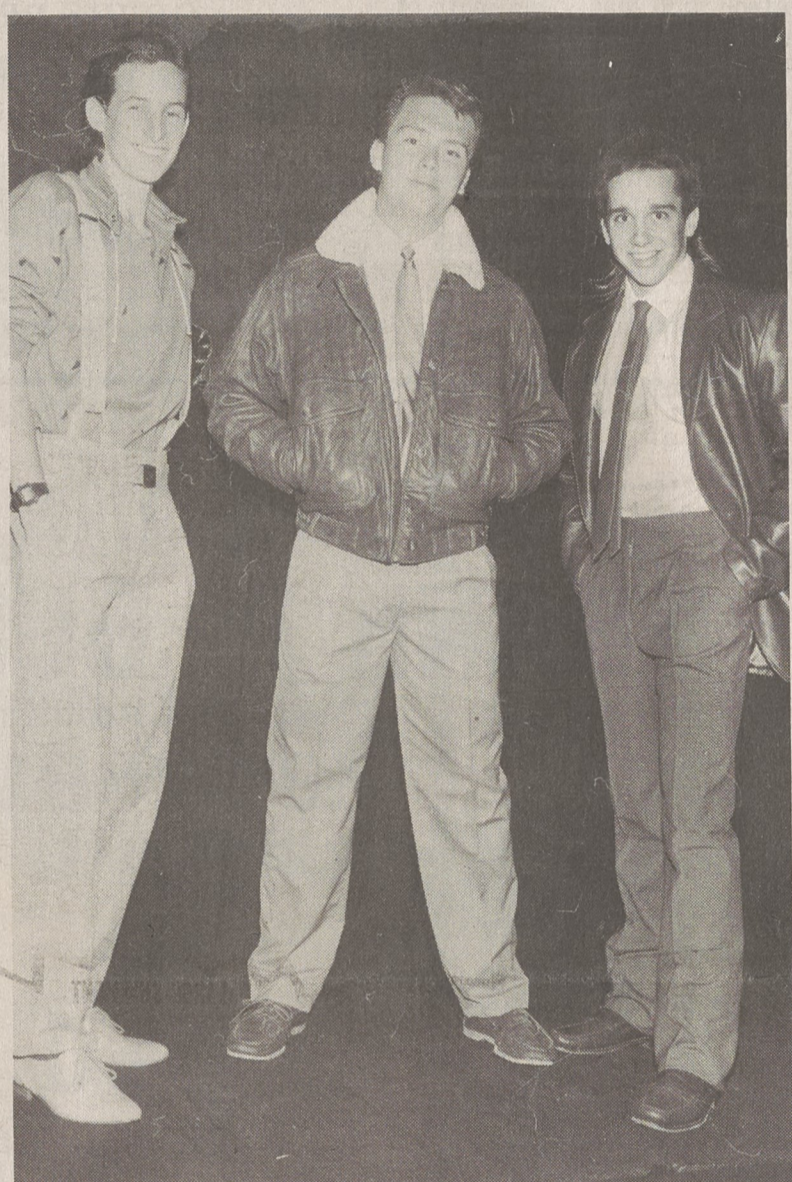

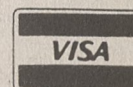
