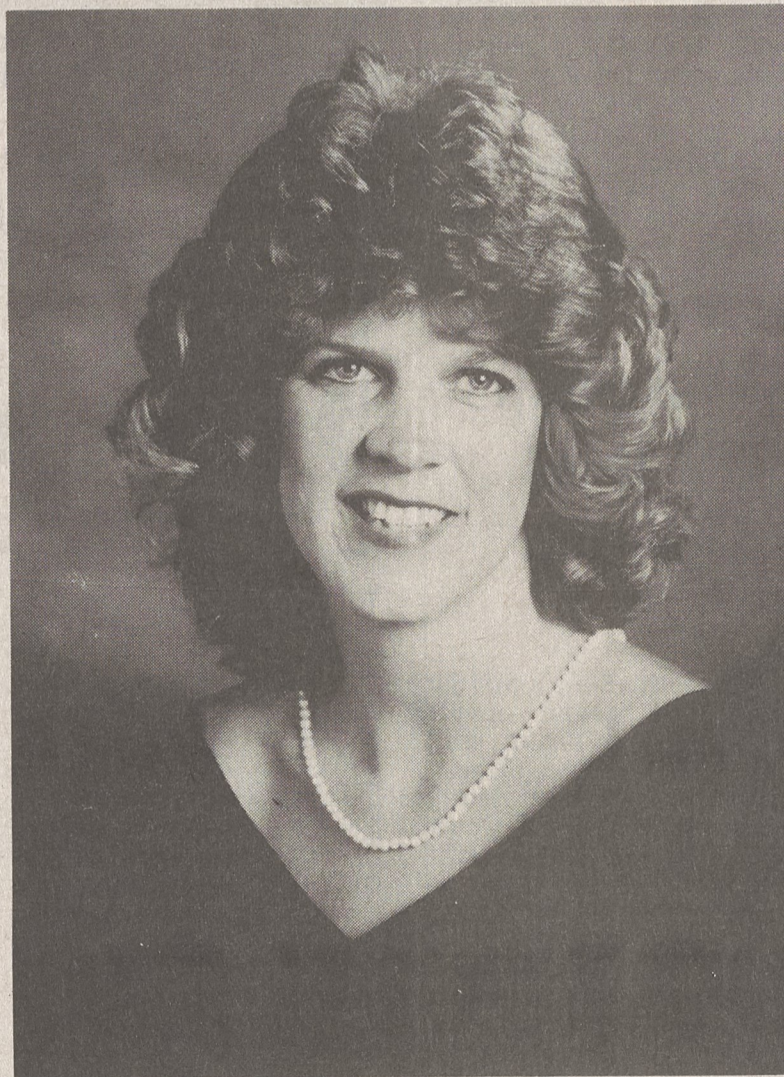
The anniversary cake was topped with red mini carnations and baby's breaths and
