DO NOT BEDECEIVED

THIS IS THE LAW....

- 1. "On Premise sale by motels, hotels and restaurants only." These establishments must meet strict guidelines to obtain and keep their permits. At least 51% of their business must be from the sale of food or lodging receipts to allow the product to be consumed on the premise. (Snack items are not considered food.)
- 2. "Off Premise sale to all other types of business." This simply means that the product cannot be consumed on the premise where purchased.
- 3. There can be NO TAVERNS, NO BARS, NO POOLROOMS or types of businesses of any nature where beer can be consumed where purchased.
- 4. Under legal control the same State laws apply as to sales to minors (under 21 years of age); and other restrictions. Therefore, NO BEER CAN BE PURCHASED BY MINORS AT ANY LEGAL CONTROL ESTABLISHMENTS AT ANY TIME.
- 5. Under Legal Control, the same strict supervision is given by the North Carolina State ABC Commission, the Department of Crime Control and Public Safety and its Enforcement Division, as elsewhere. An Alcohol Law Enforcement Officer would be assigned here to see that the State Laws and Rules and Regulations of the STATE ABC COMMISSIONS are strictly enforced.
- 6. HOW CAN ONE RECEIVE A LICENSE OR PERMIT TO ENGAGE IN THE LEGAL SALE OF BEER?
- (a) Under LEGAL CONTROL, the TOWN BOARD may appoint a local board composed of respectable and responsible local citizens to make recommendations regarding the application for a permit to sell beer.
- (b) Finally, the ALCOHOL LAW ENFORCEMENT DIVISION, as directed by State Laws, must investigate and screen each applicant before approval is granted by either the Local Board or the North Carolina State ABC Commission.
- 7. LEGAL SALE AND LEGAL CONTROL of beer will return Thousands of Dollars in direct revenue to Kings Mountain annually.
