

Nominations Being Accepted

Nominations are being accepted for the 1987 Presidential Awards for Excellence in Science and Mathematics Teaching program.

Teachers can be nominated by colleagues, administrators, students or parents of students. The deadline for postmark of nominations is March 2.

The Presidential Awards program honors six teachers in each state and jurisdiction, with two of the six receiving the Presidential Award during an expense-paid trip to Washington, D.C., in November.

This award carries with it a \$5000 National Science Foundation grant, in addition to other honors and gifts.

To be eligible, a teacher must be assigned during this school year at least half-time to classroom teaching of science or mathematics in a public or private middle/junior or senior high school in North Carolina. Teachers must also have a minimum of five years teaching experience in science or mathematics.

Supported by the NSF and managed by the National Science Teachers Association, the Presidential Awards program recognizes teachers

who have demonstrated classroom excellence. These teachers serve as models for the teaching profession.

Nominations must include name and complete home mailing address and be mailed by March 2.

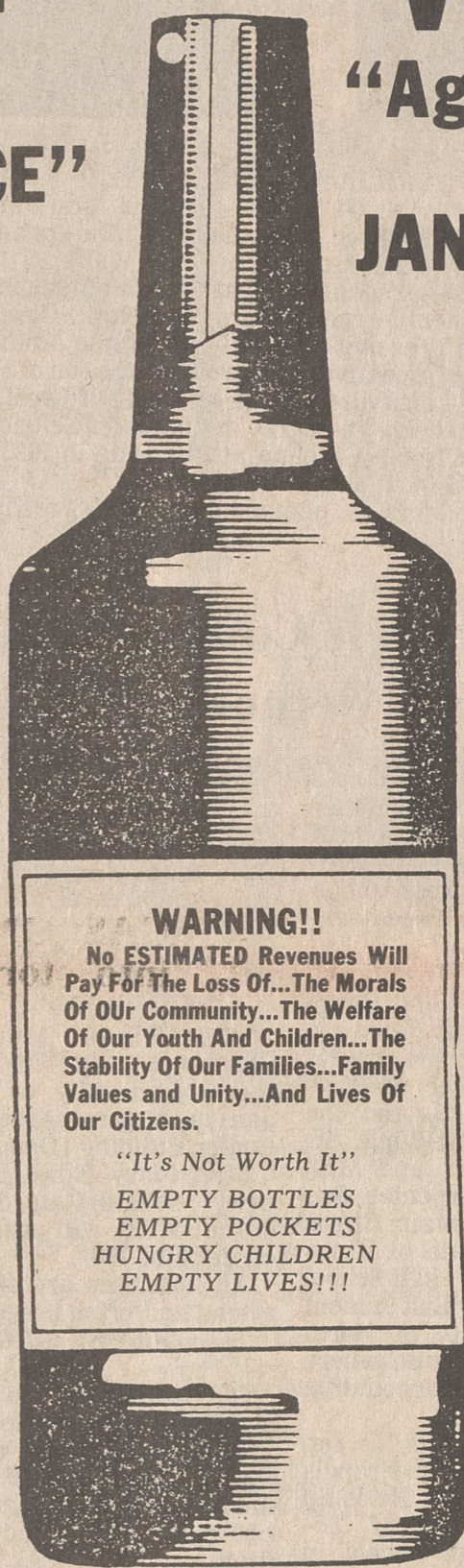
