The keynote speaker for this year's DSA Presentation will be Jerry L. Wall, a past State President (1985-1986) of the North Carolina Jaycees. Wall joined the Yadkinville Jaycees in 1972, served two terms as their chapter's Vice-President and in 1975 was elected President of the Yadkinville Jaycees. Since then he has held such state offices as District and Regional Directors, State Vice-President and State President. While serving in state offices he received such awards as the "David Gaines Memorial Award"...as the most outstanding state officer of the N.C. Jaycees, the

"Dennis Hamilton Memorial Award"...as one of the top ten state officers in the United States Jaycees, and in 1985-1986 the "Clayton A. Frost Memorial Award"...as one of the top five State Presidents in the U.S. Clayton A. Frost, while President of the N.C. Jaycees in 1946 came to Kings Mountain and chartered the K.M. Jaycee Chapter. On his return trip to Winston-Salem that night he was killed in an automobile accident in Mooresville. The U.S. Jaycees later decided that each year's top five State Presidents would receive an award in memory of Clayton A. Frost.
