## First Red Man Fishing Tourney Set March 22

Gilbertsville, Ky. — Operation Bass will conduct the first Red Man bass fishing tournament of the Piedmont Division, March 22, 1987 on Kerr at Satterwhite, signaling the start of the six-event Piedmont Division Red Man season. Entry deadline for the event is March 11. All entries must be postmarked on or before that date.

Five other Operation Bass-managed Red Man events will make up the Piedmont Division venue for 1987 as follows: April 26, Gaston/Eaton's Ferry, entry deadline April 15; May 31, Smith Mt./Water Wheel, entry deadline May 20; June 28, Gaston/Eaton's Ferry, entry deadline June 17; July 26, Potomac River/Pohick, entry deadline July 15; and August 30, Kerr/Satterwhite, entry deadline August 19.

The top 24 fishermen in the Piedmont Division after the six qualifying events will advance to one of four Regional Classics where they will compete with 96 other "working" men and women anglers for a \$33,000 "Dream" bass fishing rig consisting of a Chevrolet S-10 pick-up and a fully-rigged Ranger boat and \$15,000 in cash.

The top 10 from each of four Regionals will advance to the prestigious Red Man All-American where the winner will be awarded \$100,000; the largest cash prize of any no-entry-fee event in sport-fishing.
