

Jerry McKee Is Appointed KMH Director Of Pharmacy

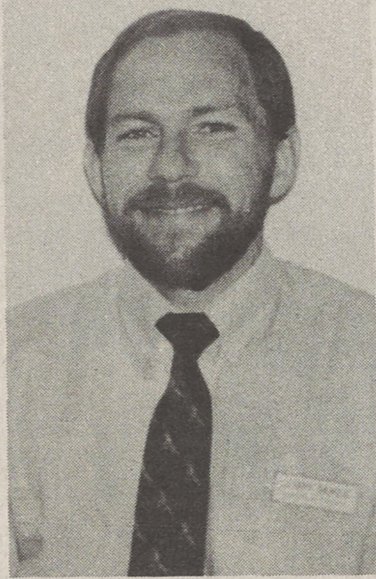

McKee and his wife, Tracey, have two children, Erin, 20 months and Jacob, two months, and make their home in Shelby.

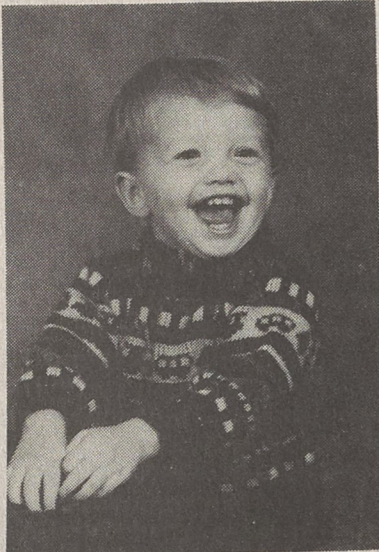
Kings Mountain Hospital, located at 706 West King St., employs 175 full and part-time employees and has 26 physicians, covering many major specialties, on the active medical staff.

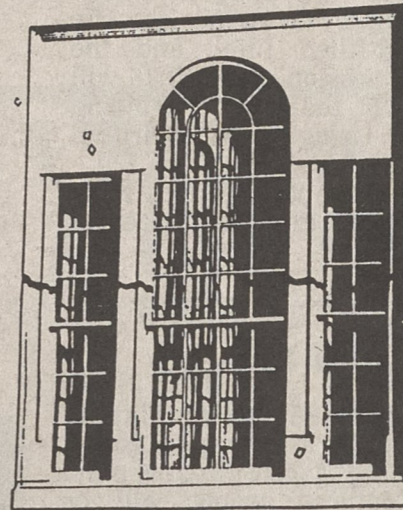

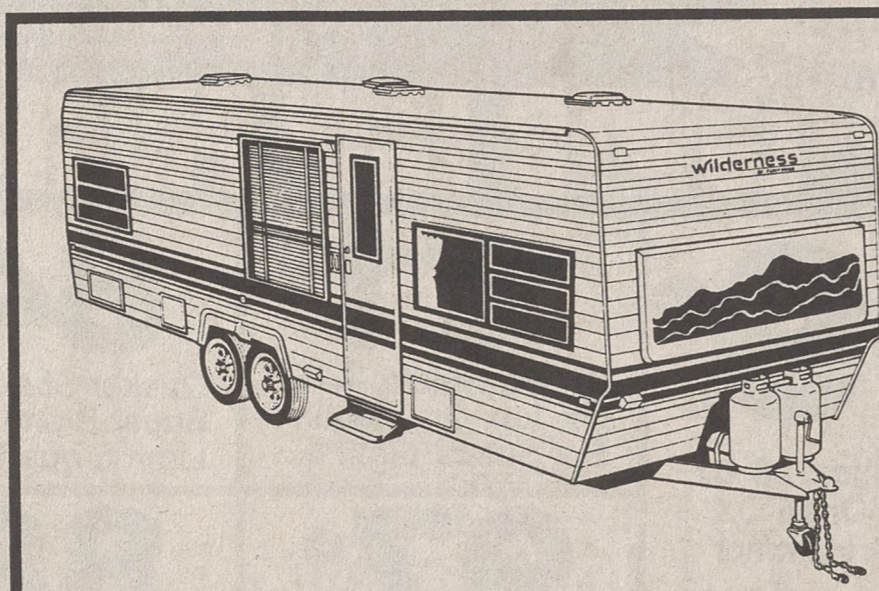
