

President Reagan's new textile trade negotiator, who offered assurances of renewed efforts to enforce quotas with the nation's textile trading partners.

William Houston, chief textile representative for the Office of the U.S. Trade Representative, met with the 10th District congressman and his staff for an hour this

"While some of the current negotiations must remain confidential, I believe the new textile negotiator is on the right course," Congressman Ballenger said. "If his assessment is correct, there is hope that the trade representative's office is taking another more serious look at the plight of our textile in-

Congressman Ballenger asked Houston, a former Cannon Mills official, to schedule a spring meeting with textile leaders in the 10th District.

"He quickly accepted," Congressman Ballenger said, "and we will soon announce a specific time for that meeting.'


