Tommy P. Bridges of Kings Mountain has been named chairman of the Kings Mountain division of Gardner-Webb College's \$5.95 million campaign, "The Future: Building on a Solid Foundation."

Bridges, owner of Bridges' Auto Parts for 30 years, said he accepted the leadership role because Gardner-Webb "has been good to me." Both Bridges and his wife, Ada W. Bridges, as well as his two daughters, attended Gardner-Webb. In fact, Mr. and Mrs. Bridges were married during Thanksgiving vacation from G-W.

A pilot, Bridges grew up with flying. His father, William Paul Bridges, was owner of Bridges Airport in Shelby. A former flight instructor, Bridges is a member of the Civil Air Patrol. He served six years on the Board of Education. He is a member of First Baptist Church in Kings Moun-

tain, where he has served as a deacon, Sunday School teacher, and R.A. leader.

Bridges, a former Bulldog Club member at the college, grew up knowing Gardner-Webb. "The influence of the college on the community is great," he said. As chairman of the Kings Mountain division, Bridges and his workers hope to raise \$100,000 in the Kings Mountain area.

The \$5.95 million campaign, to be launched in April, will provide funds for campus renovations, endowment, scholarships and faculty enrichment, including the establishment of an academic chair.

The campaign will be coordinated by M. Henry Garrity, vice president for college relations.

Shelby businessman Lloyd Best serves as national campaign chairman, and Mrs. Paris L. Yelton and Charles I. Dover of Shelby are honorary chairpersons.

Ballenger Meets With Reagan

Washington, D.C.—Congressman Cass Ballenger met Friday with President Reagan's new textile trade negotiator, who offered assurances of renewed efforts to enforce quotas with the nation's textile trading partners.

William Houston, chief textile representative for the Office of the U.S. Trade Representative, met with the 10th District congressman and his staff for an hour this

morning in Congressman Ballenger's Washington office.

"While some of the current negotiations must remain confidential, I believe the new textile negotiator is on the right course," Congressman Ballenger said. "If his assessment is correct, there is hope that the trade representative's office is taking another more serious look at the plight of our textile industry."

Congressman Ballenger asked Houston, a former Cannon Mills official, to schedule a spring meeting with textile leaders in the 10th District.

"He quickly accepted," Congressman Ballenger said, "and we will soon announce a specific time for that meeting."

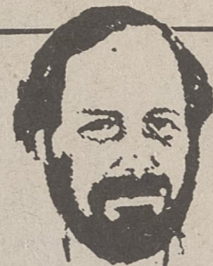

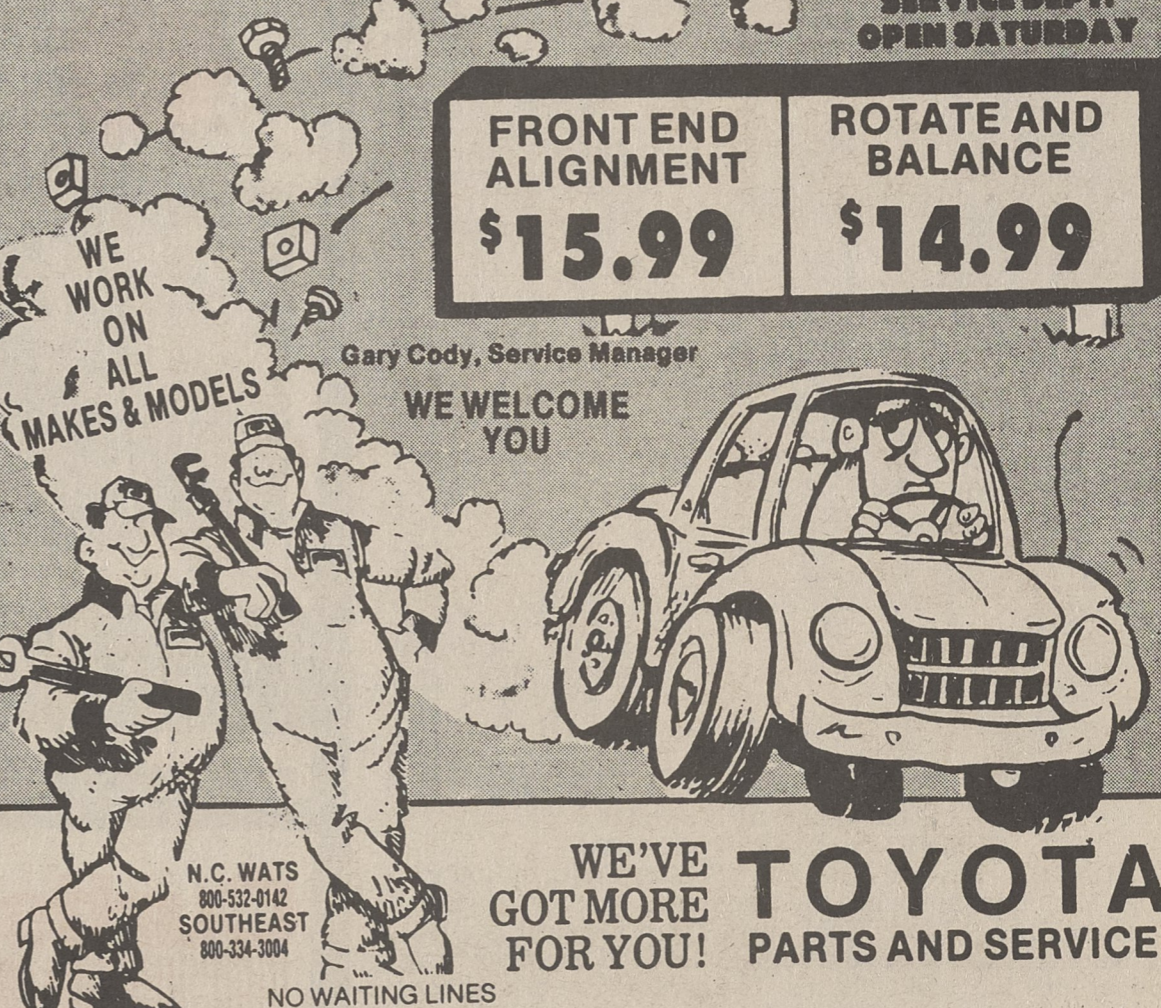
