## City Board Interviewing For Chief

The board of city commissioners, continuing an interview process to hire a new police chief, interviewed five applicants among 11 who are being considered, during an executive session Monday night.

Mayor John Moss said another meeting is tentative-ly set for next Wednesday to interview six more applicants from a total of 28 who applied for the Chief's position left vacant by the retirement of J. D. Barrett.

Acting Chief of the Department is Sgt. Bob Hayes, who is a veteran member of the staff and who has not applied for the job. Three members of the Kings Mountain Police Department join two applicants from Shelby, two from Gastonia, and four from out of the area as finalists for

out of the area as finalists for the Chief's position.

Prior to the beginning of the interview process, the board met with City Attorney George B. Thomasson and agreed to pay Southern Bell Telephone and Telegraph Company for damages to the Southern Bell System lines Southern Bell System lines caused by the City's Public Works Department crews in the amount of \$4,511.39 with the following stipulations: Southern Bell, under the arrangement, is required to provide the City of Kings Mountain engineering drawings of all lines within the City of Kings Mountain and any future construction plans and construction by Southern Bell System of lines will require written approval from the City of Kings Mountain.




