are residents of the county, but not FmHA borrowers, are eligible to become nominees for the FmHA county committee.

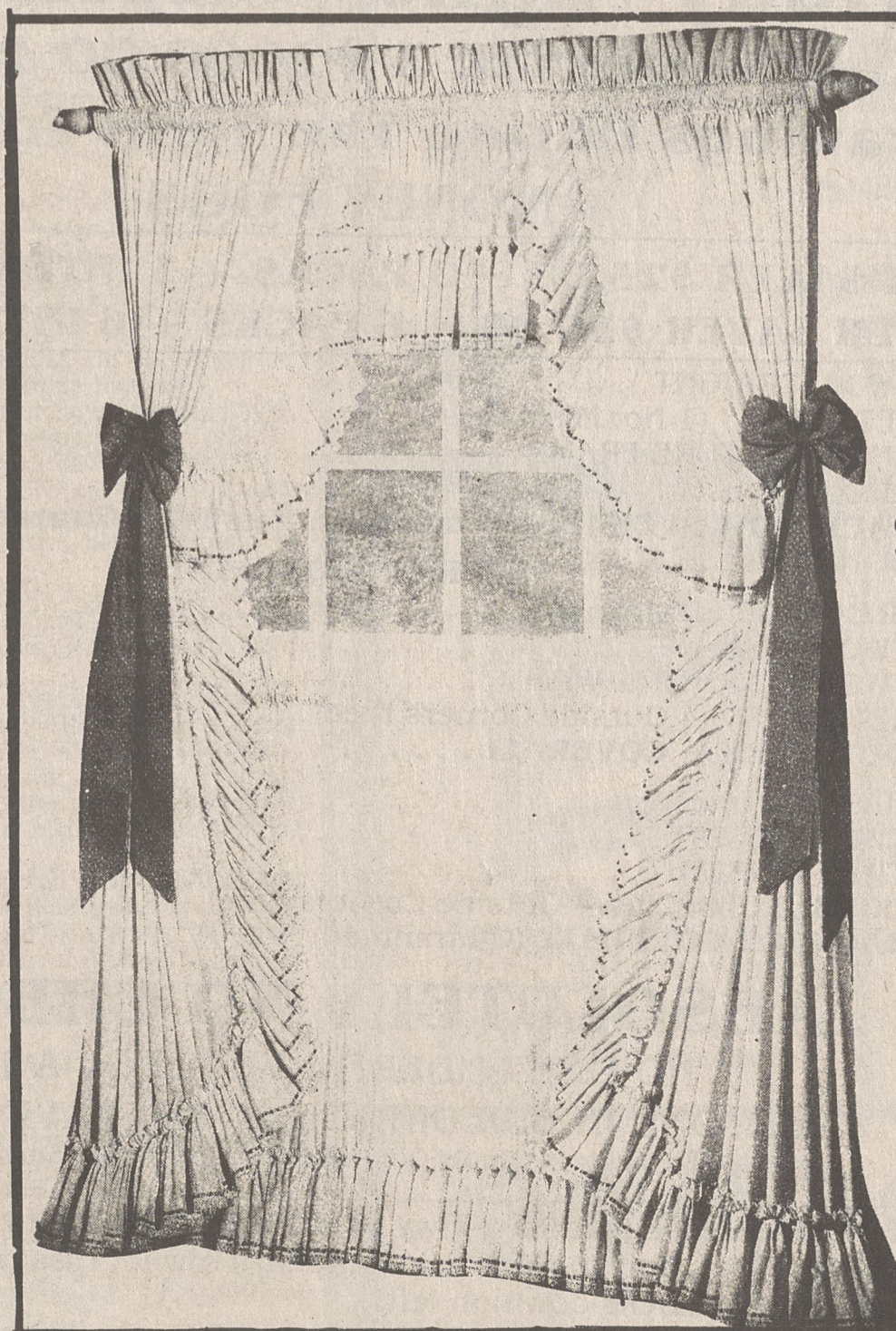
