Grover Rescue Squad To Record Children's ID

Missing children in the U.S. is one of the true horror stories of our time, a personal tragedy that seems to be occurring with ever increasing frequency. Child Registry is a new concept meant to help combat that problem. A program to provide complete identification records for your children is being conducted locally by the Grover Rescue Squad.

The idea behind Child Registry is to consolidate detailed information about a child, including recent photographs, so that the information is readily available if it should ever be needed. A 24-page Child Registry Handbook is provided and parents can fill out the appropriate pages with current photographs and health records, along with fingerprints, dental charts, physical characteristics chart, growth progress chart and even a lock of the child's hair. components of the Child Registry are all personal and family records, immunization records, an authorization for treatment of minor form and an I.Q. card for medical information.

"We support this program 100%", says Capt. Jeff Cash of the Grover Rescue Squad. A person who fills this out properly can walk into any police station in the country and they will have everything they need to start the wheels in motion to find their child.

Personnel representing the Grover Rescue Squad will be calling on homes in their district served to offer the Child Registry Program.

This program is in conjunction with the squad's special fund raiser. Each family that helps out with \$10.00 will receive the Child Registry Handbook, an 8 X 10 Family Portrait and a 2 X 3 photograph for each child that appears in the family portrait. The photographs will be taken at the Grover Rescue Squad May 16-17. Additional photograph dates will be announced at a later date.

"Your support in this project will be greatly appreciated," said Captain Cash.

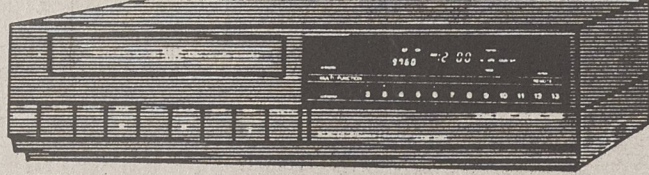

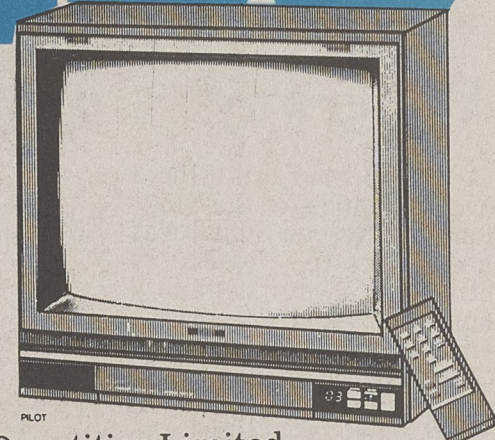
