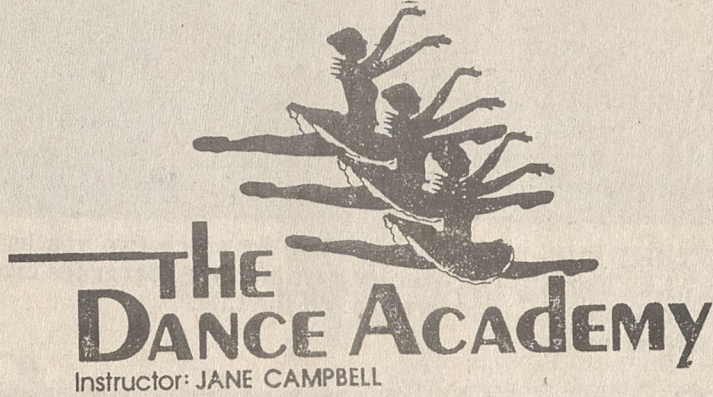

A Star Dancer theme was used for the party. Brandi and her guests enjoyed cake and ice cream and all the trimmings.

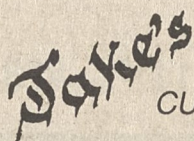
