

Mounties Host East Friday

Despite its record, East Rutherford will bring a potentially-dangerous team to Gamble Stadium. The Cavaliers return almost all of their players from last year's championship team, including SWC Player of the Year Bill Davis.

Davis, a big 200-pound running back, scored the only touchdown of the game in overtime last year as East Rutherford blanked the

Mountaineers 7-0 in the rain in Forest City. East also has a talented runner in quarterback Rodney Jimerson, a returning starter.

"Talent-wise, there's not a whole lot of difference in East Rutherford and Shelby," says KMHS Coach Denny Hicks. "They're exceptionally strong on the offensive and defensive lines and they're as big as they've ever been. They have four real good running backs. I don't know the full story as to why they've

been losing this year, but they have a tremendous amount of potential. They play a real physical brand of football and if they come down here and do what they're capable of doing, it's going to be as tough a challenge as anybody we've played."

East Rutherford was upset by Chase last week 24-19, creating a four-way tie for fifth place in the SWC between Chase, East, Kings Mountain and North Gaston, all with 1-4 records. Shelby leads the way with a 5-0 mark, followed by Burns and South Point at 4-1 and R-S Central at 3-2.

The Mountaineers will go into the game in good physical condition and just as much potential as the Cavaliers. The Mountaineers have moved the ball in the middle of the field against every opponent, but when they've gotten in scoring range penalties and turnovers have cost them.

"Turnovers is the worst thing that can happen to you in football, and penalties is the second worst, and we've had our share of both of them this year," said Coach Hicks.

Kings Mountain cannot finish with a winning record in conference play but the Mountaineers can avoid a losing season overall by winning their last two ballgames. They close out their season next week at North Gaston.

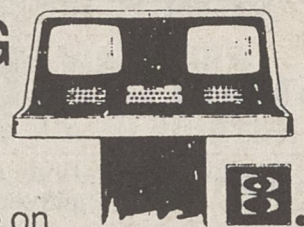

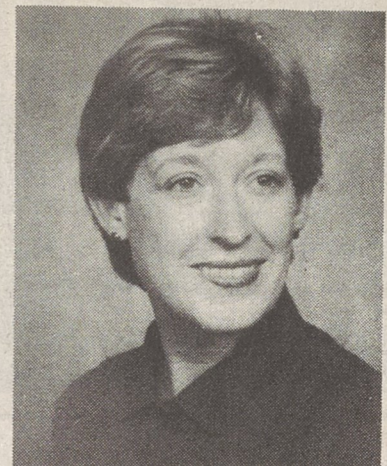
