Police Urge Motorists To Drive Carefully

Christmas holidays and New Year's holidays come exactly one week from each other and many people use the opportunity to go 'home for the holidays.' Drive safely this holiday season, urges Kings Mountain Police and N.C. State Motor Club.

It is estimated that 38 North Carolina motorists will die in traffic accidents over the upcoming Christmas and New Year holiday.

The state will count its death toll from 6 p.m. on Wednesday, Dec. 23 through

midnight Sunday, Dec. 27 for Christmas and from 6 p.m. Wednesday, Dec. 30th through midnight Sunday, Jan. 3, for New Year's.

Last year over a similar period of time 23 were killed and 982 injured over Christmas, while 28 were killed and 1,097 were injured over the New Year's holiday weekend.

This holiday law enforcement people are encouraging motorists to plan safe travel whether the trip is a short one to the corner store for last-minute shopping or a longer one to visit relatives or friends. Each trip places the driver in situations where care and proper reactions are required to make the trip a safe one.

Speeding is at the top of the list. Speeders not only lose licenses, they lose lives.

Fatigue is also a culprit. Leave early enough to allow adequate rest stops in an effort to keep you alert at all times and to help you recognize and avoid unsafe movements.

Driving and drinking. As a party-goer limit yourself to no more than one drink an hour and stop drinking one hour before driving. Don't let anyone talk you into one for the road.

Keep in mind that the alcohol content is the same in 12 ounce can of beer as in six ounce of wine or one and one half ounces 80 proof whiskey. Only time will rid the body of alcohol and its contents.

Law enforcement officers get tough when it comes to DWI. Police roadblocks and checkpoints are one of the most effective means of keeping the drunken driver off the roads and can be expected this holiday season, said Dr. John Frazier, III, president of the state-wide motor club.

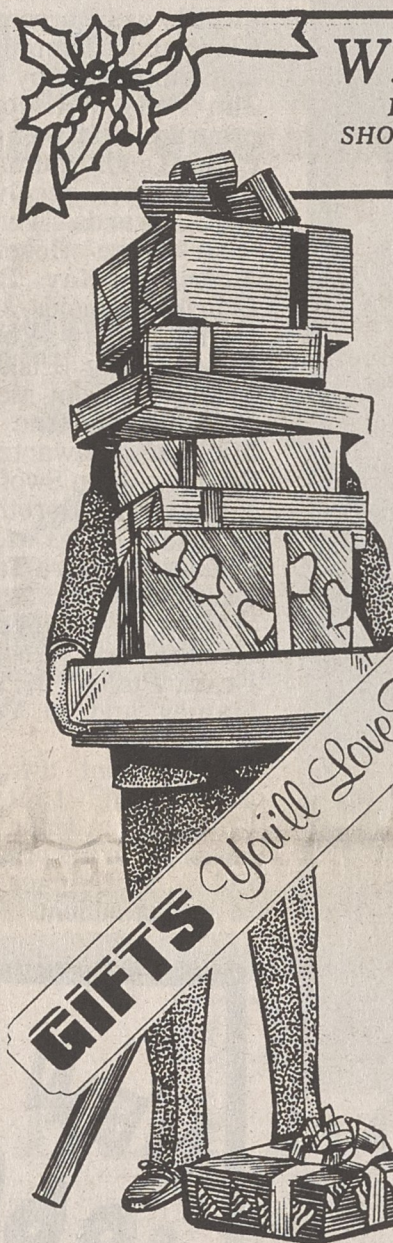

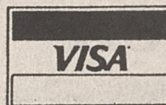

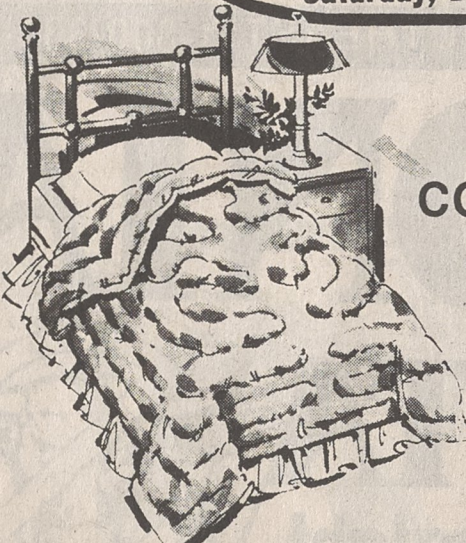
