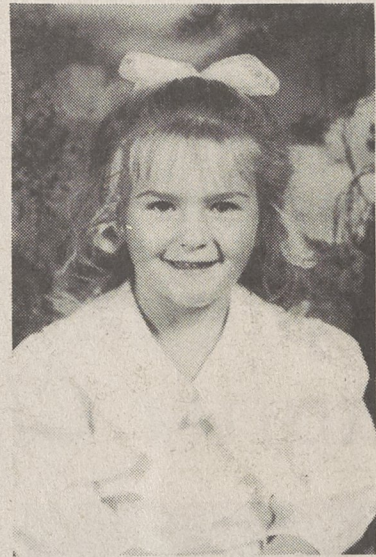


Kimberly Is Five

Kimberly Brooke Haven Stinchcomb, daughter of Kim and Cindi Stinchcomb, celebrated her fifth birthday January 4.

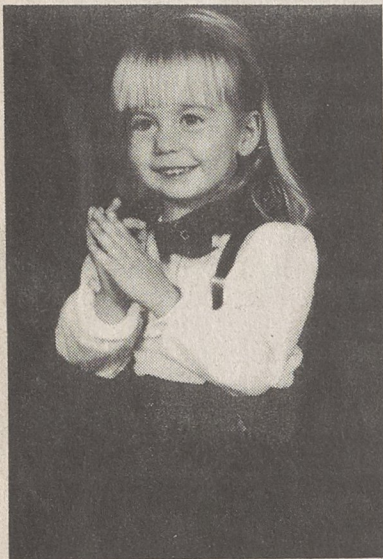

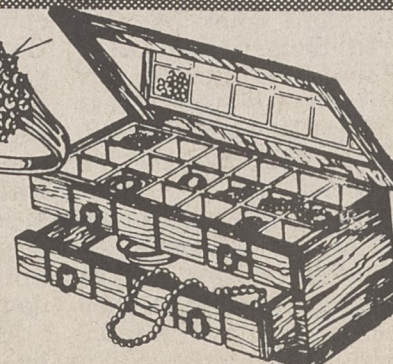
