## **Democrats** Will Meet

Cleveland County Democrats will reorganize at precinct meetings Thursday night, Jan. 21.

In Kings Mountain, West KM Precinct will meet at The Armory, East Kings Moun-tain Precinct will meet at KM Community Center, Grover Precinct will meet at Grover Rescue Squad and Bethware Precinct will meet at David Baptist Church fellowship building. All meetings are 7:30 p.m. and new officers will be elected. Meetings will be held at all 24 precincts in the county at the various polling places.

Charlie Carpenter, a member of the West Precinct, pointed out that the Cleveland County Board of Elections, decreasing the number of precincts from 28 to 24, moved the dividing lines between East and West KM precincts which means that about the same number of people will be voting at the two KM boxes. Those voters living East of Cansler Street who used to vote at West KM will vote at East precinct and those living on the Southern line of West precinct on Crocker Road will vote at West box instead of Bethware precinct, he said. The KM Board of Elections

changed their boundary lines to correspond with the county lines which means that voters can vote in both a county-conducted election and a cityconducted election at the same voting place and not have to move from one place to another to vote in instances where school board candidates are running at the same time as city board of-

program will be reviewed by the Health Council and officially presented to the board later.

\*Was told by McRae that the system will soon begin an Early Intervention program on a trial basis at Central School. The program is designed to offer special instruction to potential dropouts and is in coopera-tion with the Mental Health Department.

\*Was told by McRae that a Health Fair will be held at the junior high school during Public Health Week April 12-14. Students will be offered blood pressure screening, height and weight checks, tetanus check, and other assessments to identify areas that may need attention. There will be a seminar for parents at night.

\*Was told by McRae that UNC-Charlotte is interested in placing more student teachers in the district and training local teachers to be their supervisors in UNC-C's student training program. \*Appointed Billy King as

the board's representative on the 1988-89 School Calendar Committee.

\*Adopted a resolution of support of the high school's Southern Association of Colleges and Schools 10-year reevaluation.

\*Authorized McRae to proceed with the 1988-89 budget on the same basis as prior years, with principals and other department heads working with the Central Office staff, and later presenting their proposals to the board. McRae said a preliminary budget would be presented at the March meeting and a public-hearing and final approval slated for the April meeting.

\*Approved the retirement of Mary Page, Central teacher, effective January 22, and the resignation of Health Coordinator Paula effective Hildebrand February 1.
