

## Two Charged With Larceny

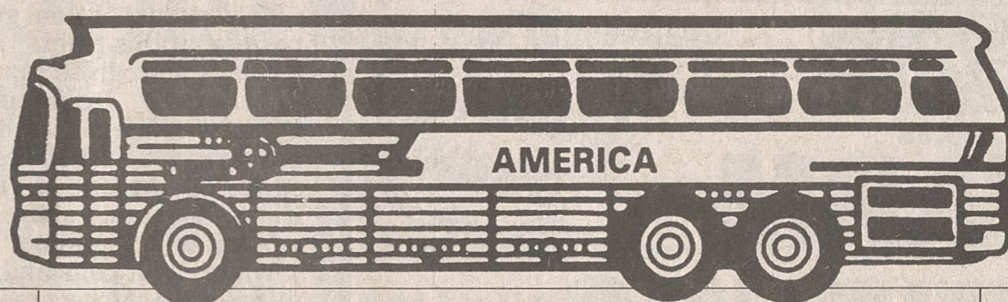
