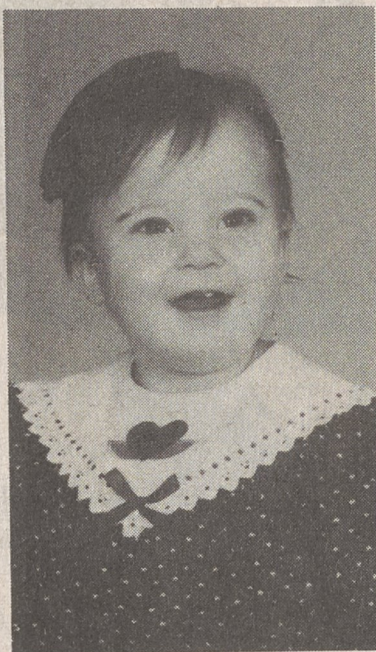

Lindsey One Year Old

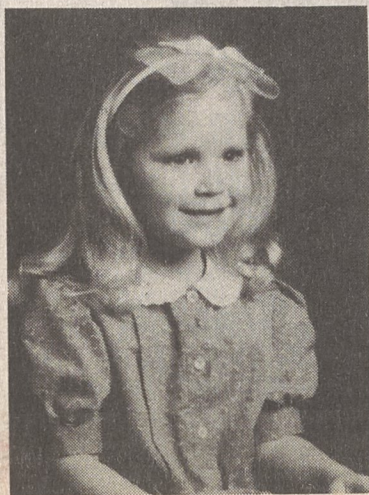

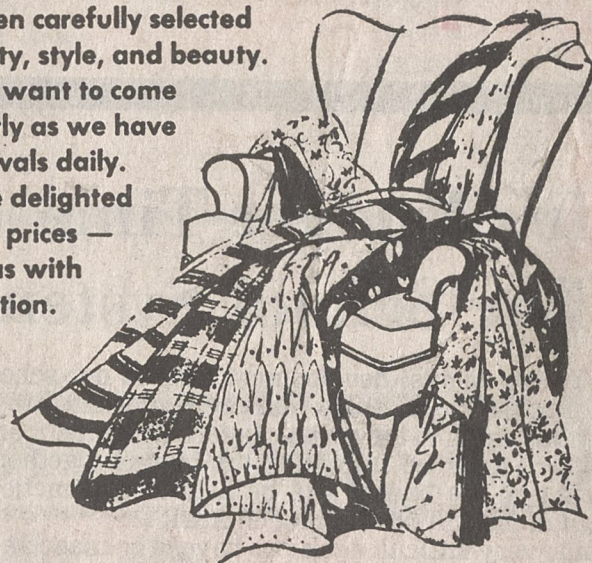
