Ken Napier. During her five years at KMJH, she was elected Kings Mountain Teacher of the Year. In 1979-80 she moved to KMHS and has taught English and drama since.

Mrs. Wells is the daughter of Lester and Blannie Hart of Lansing in Ashe County. She graduated from Northwest Ashe High School and earned her B.A. and M.A. degrees from Appalachian State University.

The Wellses are parents of Kellene, 23, a graduate of ASU and Assistant Director of Aging in Kings Mountain; Hart, 10, and Brett, 8, both students at Grover School. They reside in the Dixon Community and are active in Trinity Episcopal Church.

## Scholarship Honors KM Native

A perpetual scholarship named for Alamance County "mother of the arts", Sarah Hambricht Rhyne, Kings Mountain native, was announced last week at the Beaux Arts Ball, the annual fund raiser held by the Alamance County Arts Council at Alamance Country Club.

Mrs. Rhyne is sister of Mrs. Lawrence Patrick of Kings Mountain. A current member of the Arts Council board, she is past president of the Arts Council and was instrumental in starting the Firehouse

Galleries, Arts Round the Square, the Gallery Players, Alamance Chorale and the Alamance Civic Dance Company.

She has been active in the life of the city of Graham and became its first lady while her husband, Myron, served as mayor for more than two decades. She spearheaded the placing of planters on Graham streets and planting of the flowery pear trees around the court square.

A native of Kings Mountain, she has been a resident of Alamance County since not

long after World War II when she and her husband moved there from Kings Mountain. Though their only child, Janet, was born after they moved to Graham in 1947, Mrs. Rhyne soon activated her interest in the arts of her adopted county.

The Sarah H. Rhyne Scholarship fund will provide \$250 for a high school senior who wants to further his education in the arts. It was initially designed to be used for education at a trade school such as Alamance Community College.

## Kindergarten Registration Set

Children who will be five years old on or before October 16, 1988 should register for kindergarten in their respective school districts. If parents do not know which school their child will attend, they should call the Kings Mountain District Office at 739-4589.

Applications and Kindergarten Health Assessment Forms are available at all elementary schools. The application should be completed and returned to the school as soon as possible.

The Health Assessment Form, to be completed by the child's physician or the Health Department, is due on or before October 21.

Orientation Day for incoming kindergarten children and their parents is scheduled for May 20 at all elementary schools. At this time, parents are to bring the child's official birth certificate. No child can be enrolled without this official document. On Orientation Day parents will bring their child to school at 8:15 and re-

main for an informative session with the school principal which will last approximately one hour. The children will go to classes and enjoy a typical kindergarten day ending with lunch in the cafeteria as guest of the school system. Parents will pick their children up at 11:30 am. Regular kindergarten children will not attend school on this day.

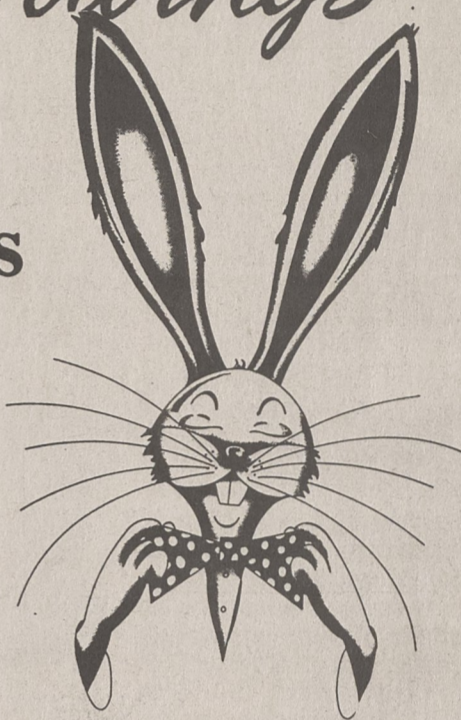

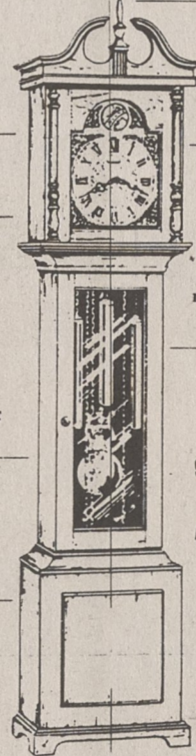

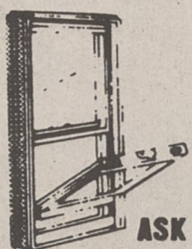
