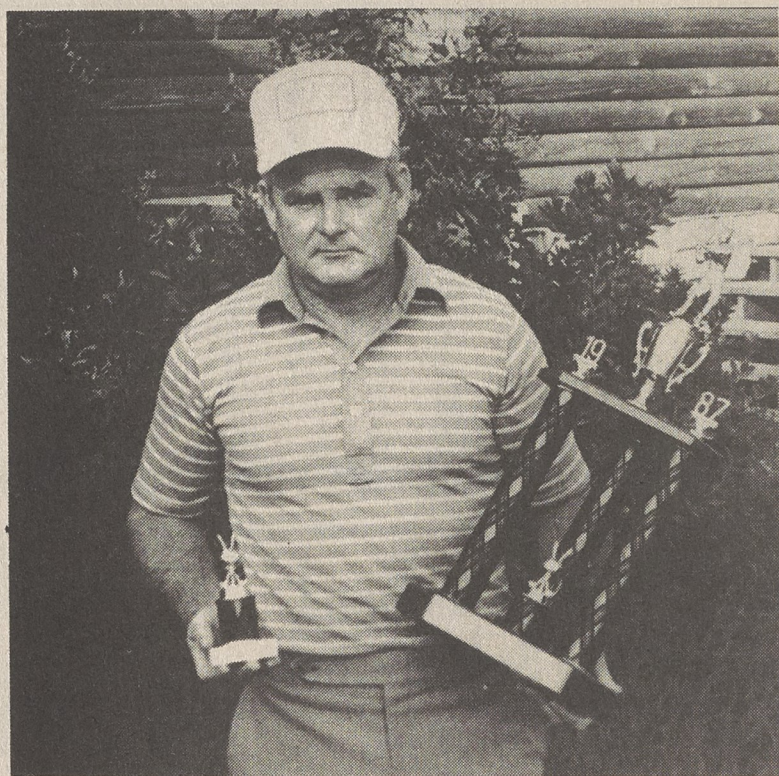

Sour Dough Bread

3/4 cup sugar
1 cup warm water...stir it up and let it sit overnight. Next morning make up bread.
1 cup bread starter
1/4 cup sugar
1 tablespoon salt
1/2 very warm water
6 cups of bread flour
1 cup of corn oil...mix it all up. Cover with cloth in a bowl. Let that sit all day. At night knead the mixture.

Next divide into three equal parts. Put in loaf pans. Let it sit over night to let that rise again. In the morning bake at 325-350 degrees for 22 minutes. Take out and eat.
