at 6,000 B.C. — the earliest evidence of man's civilization, Faust said.

On their fifth day in the Holy Land, the group went to the Wailing Wall in Jerusalem at the remains of Solomon's Temple. The wall, a very holy Jewish sight, is where thousands of people gather everyday and put prayers

written on paper into the cracks of the wall. Faust said he wrote a prayer and put it in the wall, but while he was kneeling, an Orthodox Jew grabbed him by the arm and told him not to kneel there.

After that, the group took a tour through old Jerusalem. The rest of the day was spent at a

chapel in the Hassadah Hospital, the Holocaust Museum and at the Israel Museum.

The next day, the group saw the front of the Israeli Parliament, the Valley of Ajallon (where the sun stood still so the Israelis could win the battle there), and the Valley of Eilat (where David killed Goliath).

While at the Valley of Eilat, everyone in the group picked up some little rounded stones, Faust said. "Our tour guide kept telling everyone, 'you have the one he used (to kill Goliath),' " Faust said.
