



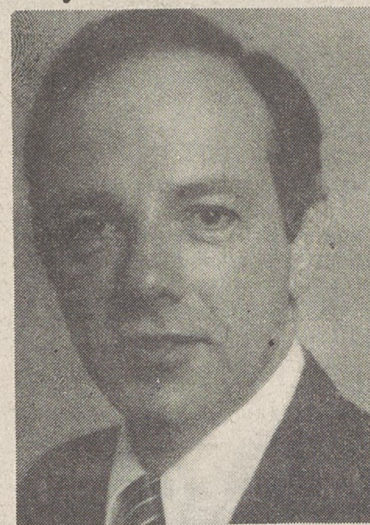

From 1980-83 Greene worked with the Department of Public Instruction in Raleigh. During the 1983-84 school year Greene served as Assistant Principal at T.C. Roberson High School in Buncombe County. 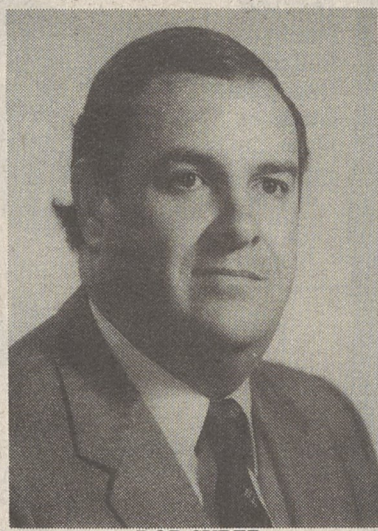
Mrs. Canova and her husband, Levy Canova, who is technical director of KMG Minerals Inc., moved to Kings Mountain from Orange Park, Fla.

Soon after he began working here, Hooper said he realized the

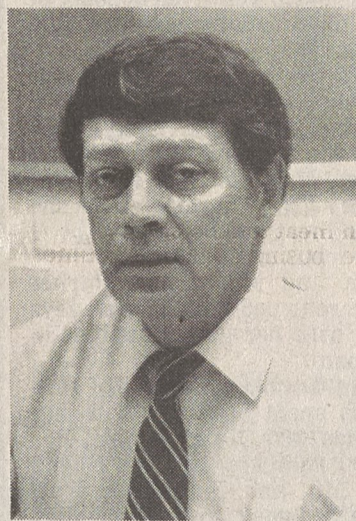
housekeeping staff at KM Hospital has good personnel; "They do their job and they do it well. They set standards, and then they meet those standards," he said.

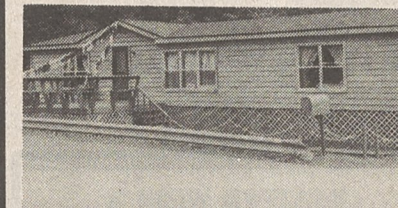

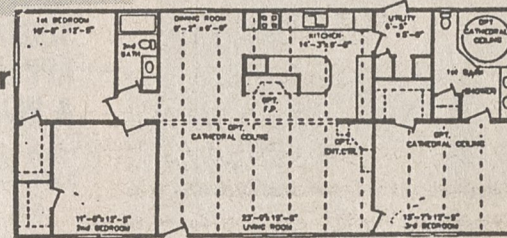
