The judges will be area professional photographers who have no connection with the Herald or other Greene Newspapers.

To enter, fill out the blank on the editorial page (the blank will also appear each week during the month of October) and return the entry blank and photos to Herald Photo Contest, P.O. Box 769, Kings Mountain, N.C. 28086. If photos are hand-delivered, you still must fill out the blank.

- To volunteers, call any law enforcement agency or the Girl Scouts.
