Kings Mountain's biggest law-enforcement problem is not hard-core drugs but alcohol, says Police Chief Warren Goforth.

Goforth said that local officers have begun drug education in the community and are available to give

programs before school and civic groups.

"All communities have some problem with drugs and we are no exception," said the Chief who said that any major highway such as Interstate 85 can be a dropping point for any usage of drugs. "This is not a hot spot for drugs," he said. However, the Chief warns that Kings Mountain is becoming a hot spot for alcohol abuse and the Police Department is cracking down on drunk drivers with a newly-enacted DWI Task Force.
"We can already see a big difference on the arrest

Chief Goforth said the recent issuance of automatic weapons replacing the revolver was done to update equipment. "Revolvers were around in the days of Wyatt Earp," said the Chief who said that weapons are more accessible to the public now and the most-modern equipment is needed in law enforcement. "I don't see a major volume of drugs in Kings Mountain," he said. "There may be some marijuana and some cocaine. The alcohol problem is a big problem," he added.


