Community Schools Summer Day Camp Scheduled At East Elementary School

The camp will operate from 7:30 a.m. until 5:30 p.m. Monday through Friday. Early arrival supervision will be provided from 6:30-7:30 a.m. for an additional charge of \$5 per week, per child.

Lunch will be available for those who do not bring lunch for \$3.50 per week. Lunch may be included in the cost of the camp.

Cost of the camp is \$25 per week for the first child and \$10 for

each additional child in the same family. Camp fees must be paid in advance of the week of attendance.

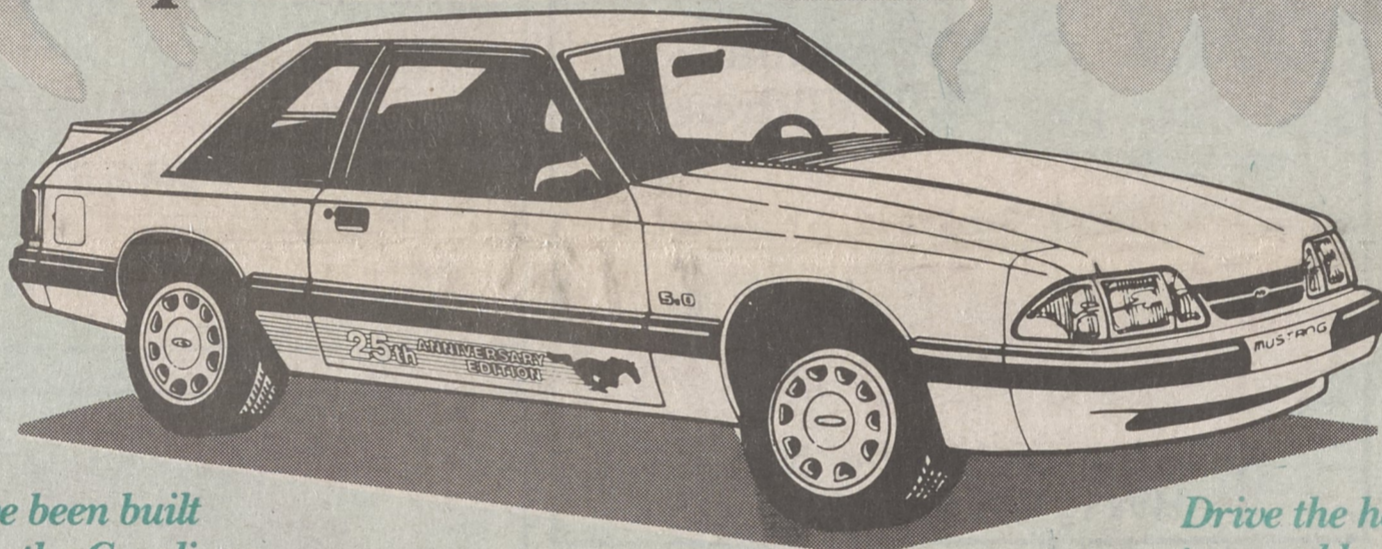
Each participant must have some type of insurance coverage to participate. Cost of insurance is \$5.75.
