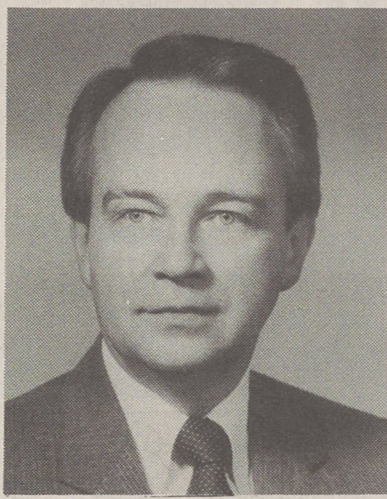

## Committee Selects Marvin

Washington, D.C. — Senator Helen Rhyne Marvin has been named as a member of the Children, Families and Social Services Committee of the National Conference of State Legislatures (NCSL).

The committee is part of NCSL's Assembly on the Legislature (AOL), which serves as a forum of the exchange of ideas and information among state legislatures. The AOL meets three times each year to address critical issues facing the states—twice in state capitals and one in conjunction with NCSL's Annual Meeting. Issues high on the committee's agenda this year include welfare reform, including child support enforcement, child care, and education and training; financing health and human services programs; and coordination of services to clients. The committee also will complete the publication "Family Policy: Recommendations for State Action."

Senator Marvin is from Gastonia and has represented the state's 25th Senatorial district for the past 13 years, during which time she has been a leading advocate for children and families.

"Serving on the Children, Families and Social Services Committee will provide me with a unique opportunity to discuss state issues with state legislators and legislative staff from throughout the country," Senator Marvin said. "Through the AOL and NCSL, we

will be able to share innovative ideas on how to approach the issues facing our nation."

NCSL represents the legislators and staffs of the nation's 50 states, its commonwealths and territories. NCSL has three basic objectives: to improve the quality and effectiveness of state legislatures; to

foster interstate communication and cooperation; and to assure state legislatures a strong, cohesive voice in the federal system.

Senator Marvin will represent the North Carolina Senate when the committee meets during the NCSL at Tulsa, Oklahoma, in August.

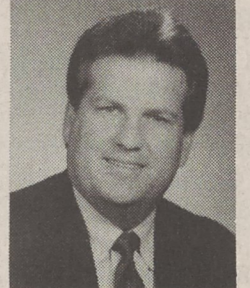
The church sponsors a gospel singing every fourth Saturday night. Pastor Clint Day said the public is invited.
