Ushers were Eric Early and Chad Farr.

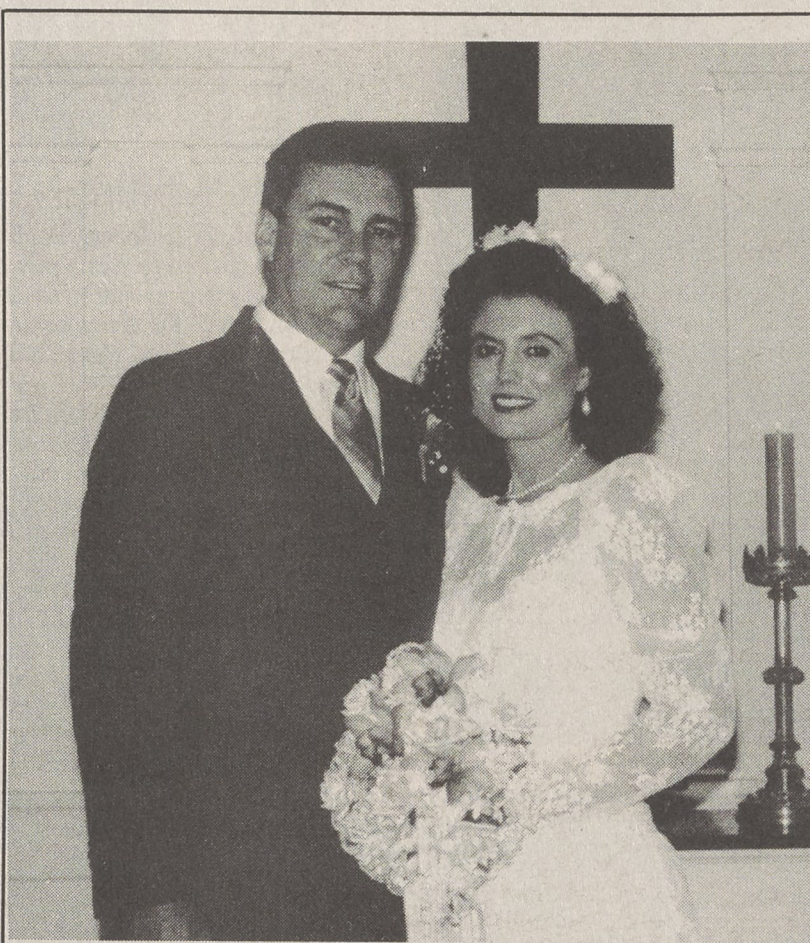

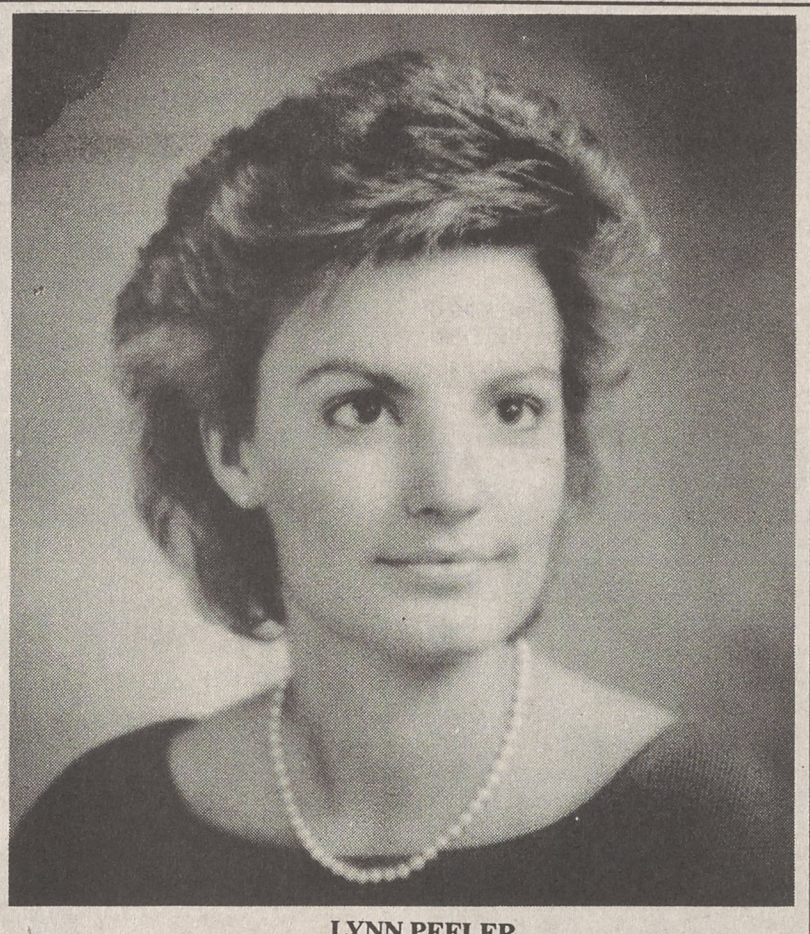
