Winners of the local meet will advance to regional competition June 24 at 10 a.m. at Shelby High School. The top two places in each event there will advance to the state finals to be held July 14 in Raleigh. Approximately five winners at the state meet will be selected to participate in the national finals in Hershey, Pa., August 12.

The purpose of the Hershey's track and field program is to create a form of recreation and participation for the youth of America. The philosophy of the program is to

stimulate participation, enjoyment, and physical exercise. The program is open to both boys and girls in the 9-10, 11-12, and 13-14 age divisions. Competition in each division will include 100 meter dash, 200 meter dash, 400 meter dash, 800 meter run, 4 x 100 meter relay, standing long jump and softball throw.

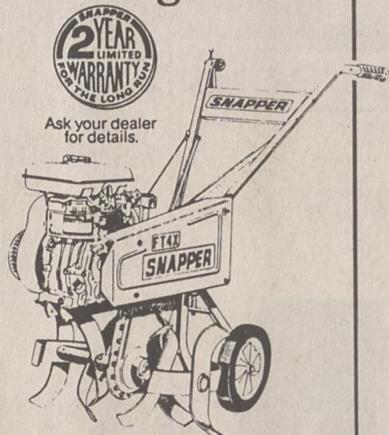

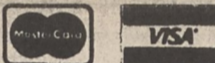
