House and it will have to pass both the Senate and House before it goes to a vote of the people." Royal is proposing that the question of a lottery go to the people for a vote on Nov. 7. Harris' amendment would set the vote the same time as the date of the next general

When and if the Senate votes on the lottery issue, Harris will call for an amendment. "It's unfair to those who live outside the corporate limits of a city not to have a vote on something as important as this issue and if the vote should come up on Nov. 7th this year there would only be a handful of people making the decision," he said, noting that people turn out at the polls when a sheriff is up for election or legislators are up for election. Harris quoted polls that estimate that 60% or less will be casting ballots November 7 when very few names are on the ballots.

A multi-billion dollar highway construction program has been the biggest logiam to adjournment of the 1989 General Assembly. Harris said legislators are hearing howls of protest from citizens pulling up to gas pumps this week and paying an additional 5 cents for gasoline, a tax voted by the General Assembly to raise teacher pay and build roads.

Harris doubts the lottery issue will come up to a vote in the House this week. "Legislators are ready to go home," he said.
