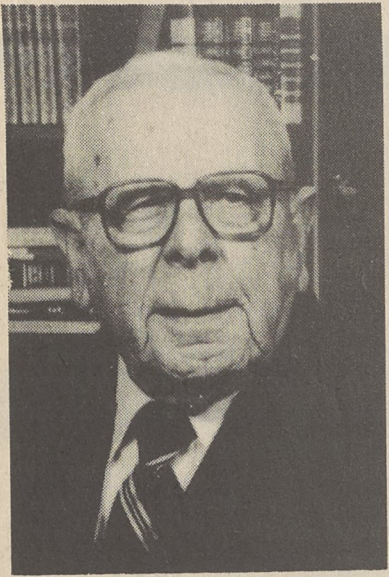


## Obituaries



### FRANK WARE

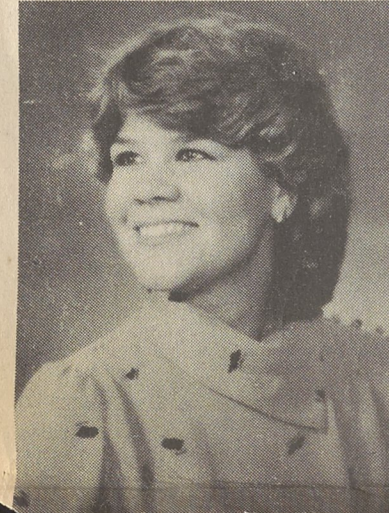
Frank Ware, 88, of Route 5, Kings Mountain, died October 2, 1989 at Kings Mountain Hospital after several weeks illness.

time as the school board election on Nov. 7. Filing period for both city school board and city officials, however, were at the same time.

All three incumbents face opposition at the polls Tuesday.

District 2 Councilman Humes Houston is opposed by Gilbert (Pee Wee) Hamrick and Elvin Greene.

District 5 Councilman Fred Finger is opposed by Marshall (Coot) Camp.

District 6 Councilman Harold

Phillips is opposed by Floyd (Will) Sanders, Jerry White, Willard Boyles and Scott Neisler.

Outwardly, there has been little political activity. All candidates have placed signs in strategic areas in the city and have distributed political cards and run newspaper advertisements. Six of the 10 candidates, who responded to a forum sponsored by the Chamber of Commerce last Monday evening at Barnes Auditorium, expressed similar views on questions posed by a small audience. Candidates have been pumping hands this week to contact voters and are predicting a heavy turnout at the polls on Tuesday.

assistance, will be offered. She says that property owners who sustained damages by Hugo should settle up with their insurance companies first and then apply for their uninsured losses by calling the toll free Hotline. Mrs. Ledford said that a toll-free disaster information hotline has been set up and the number is 1-800-458-5095. The Hotline will be manned every day from 8 a.m. to 7 p.m., including weekends. Operators are prepared to answer any questions concerning the application for assistance, documentation, directions to

Disaster Application Centers and types of assistance.

"I'm glad the citizens in Kings Mountain and throughout my congressional district will have the opportunity to benefit from this much needed relief," said 10th District Congressman Cass Ballenger. "With time, hard work, and these additional resources, I am hopeful that we will be able to put these trying times behind us very quickly."

A Disaster Application Center is open, through Saturday, on Highway 321 at the old Country Advantage in Hickory, according to Congressman Ballenger's office. Application for agricultural disaster assistance should be made at the County ASCS office in Shelby.
