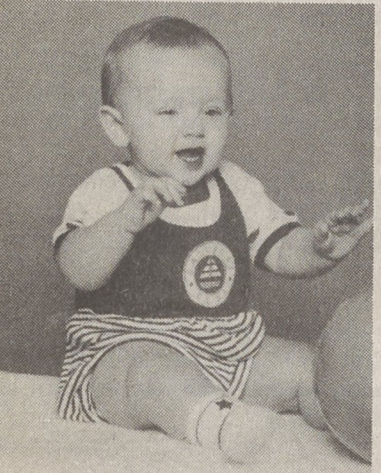


COLT McABEE

Colt is the son of Debbie Goforth and grandson of Mary Goforth, both of Kings Mountain.

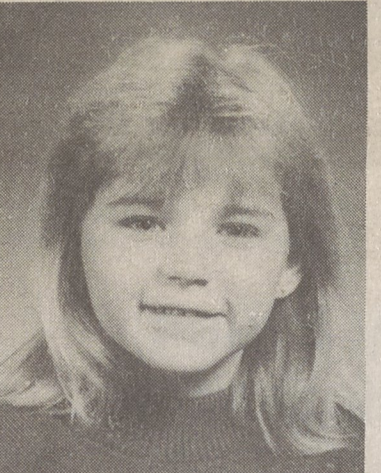

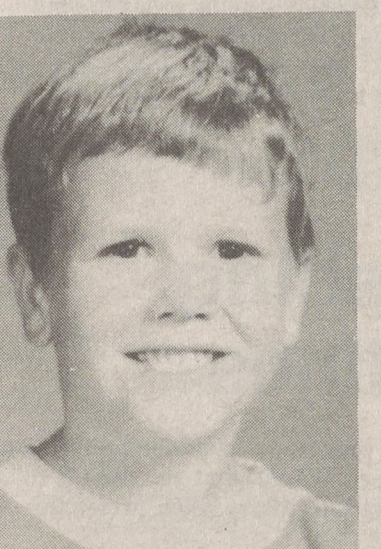
Andrea Lail Eight Years Old

Co-Chairs Public Health Study Committee

Harris On Four Committees

Senator Ollie Harris of Kings Mountain has been appointed to four committees in the N. C. General Assembly by Senator Henson P. Barnes, president pro tempore of the N. C. Senate.

Harris will co-chair the Public Health Legislative Study Commission, will serve on the Mental Health Legislative Study Commission, serve on the Legislative Services Study Commission and serve on the Social Services Legislative Study

Commission.

A nine-term senator, Harris will serve on the panel to examine the need to improve the statewide public health delivery system through the local communities. The commission will also seek to determine the need for additional legislation to deal with AIDS.

One of the mental health panel's tasks will be to review and make recommendations regarding the implementation of the Comprehensive Long Range Plan

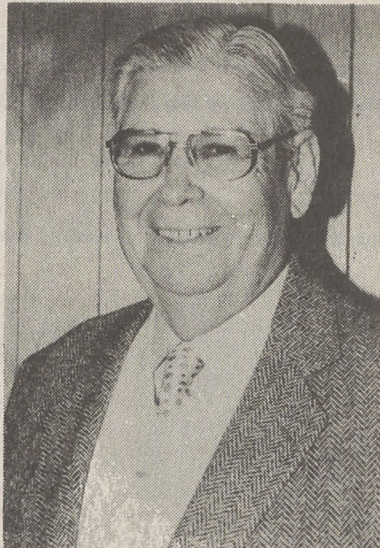
for Adults with Severe and Persistent Mental Illness. Other issues to be studied will include insurance coverage for mental illness and chemical dependency and mental health services in the criminal justice system.

The Legislative Services Study Commission will assess the efficiency of the operation of the Legislative Services division of the N.C. General Assembly. This broad assessment will cover all legislative services, including per-

sonnel, facilities, furnishings, bill drafting and enrolling.

The Commission on Social Services will continue an examination of the need for improvements in the state as a social services system and develop legislation to make those improvements.

"I am very pleased that Senator Harris has agreed to serve on these study commissions," said Senator Barnes. "His knowledge of and commitment to these areas will be most beneficial to our committees."

State Park Hit Hard

downed trees and make repairs. Park officials began assessing the damage Friday morning and have worked long hours since the storm.

"The high winds caused a great deal of damage to trees and buildings at several parks, and we're working hard to clean up and make these parks operational," said

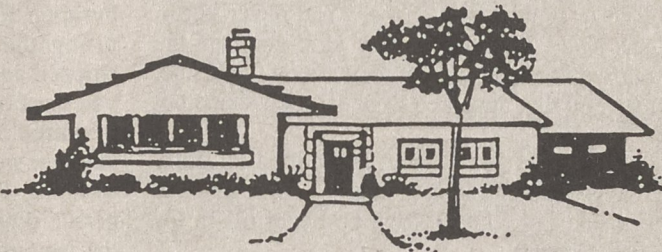

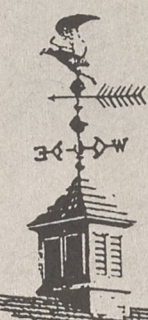
