Evelyn Willis says she is encouraging her family to come visit so they'll be in the Grover News.


Maria Harry's sister from Paris comes with encouragement this week to be with Maria, who is again in the hospital in Alabama.

We all were encouraged by the good and long life of Charlie Turner, and the good and long marriage of Mr. and Mrs. Marvin Turner.


