

Fall Leaf Report For Western N.C. Mountains

This is a report on the status of fall colors in the mountains of North Carolina.

COLOR TRANSITION:

Leaves at elevations between 3,000 and 4,000 feet are near 100 percent color transition, while those at elevations between 2,000 and 3,000 feet are seeing a 75 percent color change.

The mountains are bathed in golden and warm red hues, with the golden orange sugar maples, yellow hickories and poplars, red and yellow red maples and burgundy and maroon oak trees providing some of the best color. Yellow goldenrods and pale blue asters are among the wildflowers still blooming.

ASHEVILLE AREA AND BLUE RIDGE PARKWAY:

"The Asheville area is about a week to ten days late in turning color this year," said Blue Ridge Parkway Spokesman Jim Ryan. "That is due to the heavy rains this summer and in the early fall. The leaves should be good on into the second week of November in the immediate Asheville area."

The U.S. Forest Service reminds visitors to take warm clothing on leaf watching trips, because the higher elevations can get quite chilly.

Some good leaf trails include: (a) the narrow and winding state Route 80 from Old Fort to Burnsville, (b) U.S. 64 between Brevard, Franklin and Murphy and (c) the Forest Heritage Scenic Byway, a 70-mile circle from U.S. 276 outside Brevard to Route 215 south to Rosman and from U.S. 64 back to Brevard.

Traveling along the Parkway north to Craggy Gardens and south to Mount Pisgah and between Asheville and the Linville Falls

area should also provide some pretty viewing.

CHEROKEE INDIAN RESERVATION AND MAGGIE VALLEY:

The Cherokee Indian Reservation and Maggie Valley are experiencing an 80 to 90 percent color transition. U.S. 19 between Bryson City and Fontana Village is a good leaf-watching route. The dirt Balsam Mountain Road from the Blue Ridge Parkway to Round Bottom and on to Big Cove Road into Cherokee is very scenic, but

visitors are advised to use four-wheel drive vehicles after rain-showers.

U.S. 276 north from Maggie Valley and left onto Cove Creek Road into Cataloochee Valley is spectacular. Cataloochee Valley has many hiking trails and evening visitors may be fortunate to see wild deer and wild black bears in their natural habitat.

GRANDFATHER MOUNTAIN and the NORTHERN MOUNTAINS:

Although the highest elevations were the earliest to change and now have lost many of their leaves, most of Avery County, with trees in the 3,000 foot elevation, has foliage in golden hues and rusty reds. The warm hues are not as flamboyant as earlier in the season, but still provide some nice vistas.

U.S. 221 from Marion into Blowing Rock and state Route 181 from Morganton to Grandfather Mountain are good leaf trails. State Route 194 between Valle Crucis and Banner Elk and between Deep Gap and Jefferson, as well as state Highway 184 between Sugar Mountain and Banner Elk are worth seeing.

GREAT SMOKY MOUNTAINS NATIONAL PARK:

In the Great Smoky Mountains National Park on the North Carolina side, foliage development is at 100 percent, according to Spokesman Glenn Caldwell. U.S. 441, also called New Found Gap Road, between Gatlinburg and New Found Gap, Tenn., shows

about a 60 to 75 percent color transition. The drive on Clingman's Dome Road between New Found Gap and Clingman's Dome overlooks some pretty areas. "The color on the Tennessee side will be good on into November," Caldwell predicted.

CHIMNEY ROCK:
Chimney Rock Park in the lower

elevations is seeing a 25 percent color change, but later in the month it will be nearing its peak. The

drive along U.S. 74 between Asheville and Chimney Rock is especially pretty.
