gymnasium. There will also be slides depicting the early history of the school and short role plays. "It will be light and fun," she said.

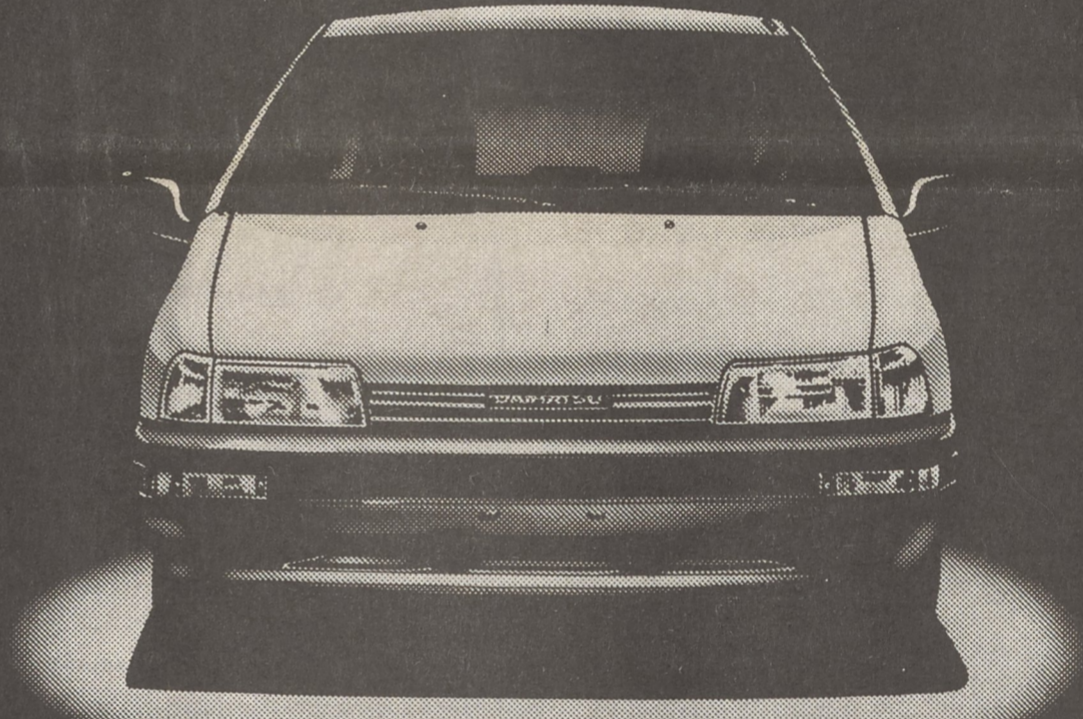
