# KMHS Runners Win SWC

Kings Mountain High's cross-country team won its first Southwestern 3-A Conference championship Thursday at North Gaston High in Dallas.

The Mountaineers placed five runners in the top 12 to far out-distance second place East Rutherford. KM finished with 35 points to 73 for the Cavaliers and 78 for defending champion R-S Central.

Top finisher for the Mountaineers was senior Chris Henson, who was second overall in 18:25. John Forrest was fourth at 18:41, Ronnie Yarboro eighth at 18:55, Shane Sessoms ninth at 18:57 and Bill Foard 12th at 19:05.

Those five runners, as well as Brady Goforth, will represent KMHS in the Western Regionals Thursday at Freedom High School in Morganton.

Eric Spicer shot a 236 to win the first flight. Mike McDaniel was second at 245.

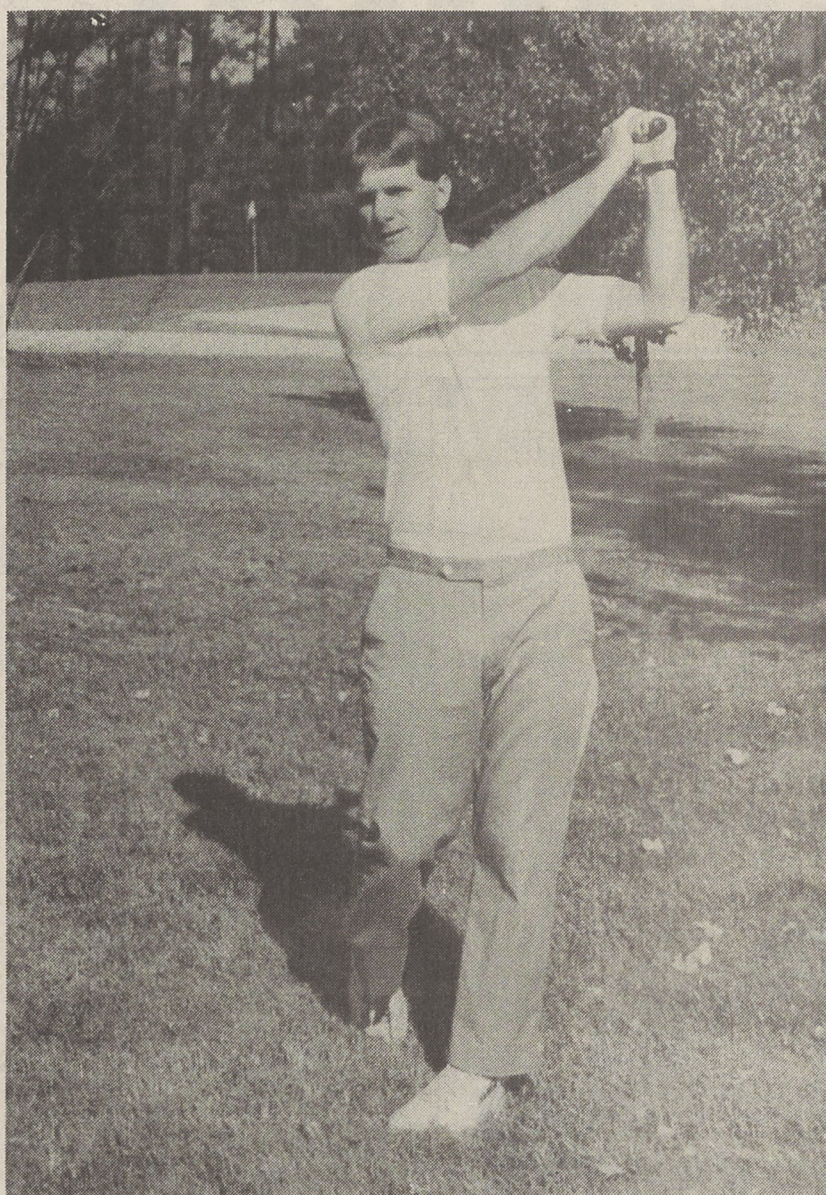

The win broke a tie between the Mountaineers and Indians for third place in the Western Piedmont Conference. St. Stephens finished 9-5 in the league while KM was 8-6 in the conference and 10-6 overall in its first year of soccer.

"We can't allow them into our secondary.

"They come off the ball as well as Shelby does," he continued. "If we don't get off the line and get underneath their pads we'll have basically the same problem we had in the fourth quarter against Shelby."

"Offensively, we're going to have to beat them to the snap," he said. "We're going to have to get on their side of the line of scrimmage. They have real good speed up front. If we don't get to them first they'll be in our backfield all night."
