Hugo Hotline To Close Nov. 21

"The Hurricane Hugo State/Federal Disaster Information Hotline for North Carolina will close effective 6 p.m. Nov. 21," announced Tom Credle, Federal Coordinating Officer.

People who have questions concerning the hurricane or their possible eligibility for state/federal assistance, are advised to contact the hotline before this date.

"The sooner we receive the call, the sooner the concern can be addressed," stated Credle. "We urge people to place their calls now."

To date the hotline has received more than 6,500 calls. At first most were requests for Disaster Application center (DAC) locations. Following the closing of the

DAC's most calls have been requests for assistance or information.

Those who may be eligible for assistance are Hugo victims who

sustained damage no fully covered by insurance.

Grover Leases Fire Station

Grover Town Board Monday night leased the present fire department and police department to Grover Rural Fire Department for 99 years.

The lease, also signed by Cleveland County Commissioners, includes the land and a 1973 Ford fire truck.

Under the arrangement, the town agrees to pay \$7500 a year for three years for fire protection and .381 cents per \$100 taxable valuation each year thereafter. The fire department paid up the \$1 a year lease cost for duration of contract.

Fire Chief Joe Boheler and Assistant Chief Gary Dowda thanked the board and said that an

open house will be held about a year from now in the fire department which is expected to be expanded.

"We're looking forward to a good relationship for the next 99 years," said Mayor Bill McCarter.

The mayor said the town will take any of its supplies out of the fire department within 30 days.

In other business, the board: + At recommendation of Attorney Andy Neisler and following a long discussion, attached to the recently-adopted mobile home ordinance the definition of a lot. For the purpose of the new ordinance, any tract or tracts owned by

any one person shall be considered one lot if they are contiguous regardless of the number of deeds involved.

+ Turned down request from Richard Evans who asked for placement of a 14x60 foot trailer on an individual lot.

+ Agreed to fix a driveway damaged by recent sewer construction and to repair a big dip on Walnut Avenue and a sidewalk damaged by Hurricane Hugo on Cleveland Avenue.

+ Released state economic development funds of \$142 to Isothermal Commission for use in Grover

+ Approved resolution supporting a Woolpert Company water system study which was part of a county-wide water study and reported that software equipment for the town was to be installed next week and a representative of the computer company would be in town for several days to instruct Clerk Debora Philbeck.

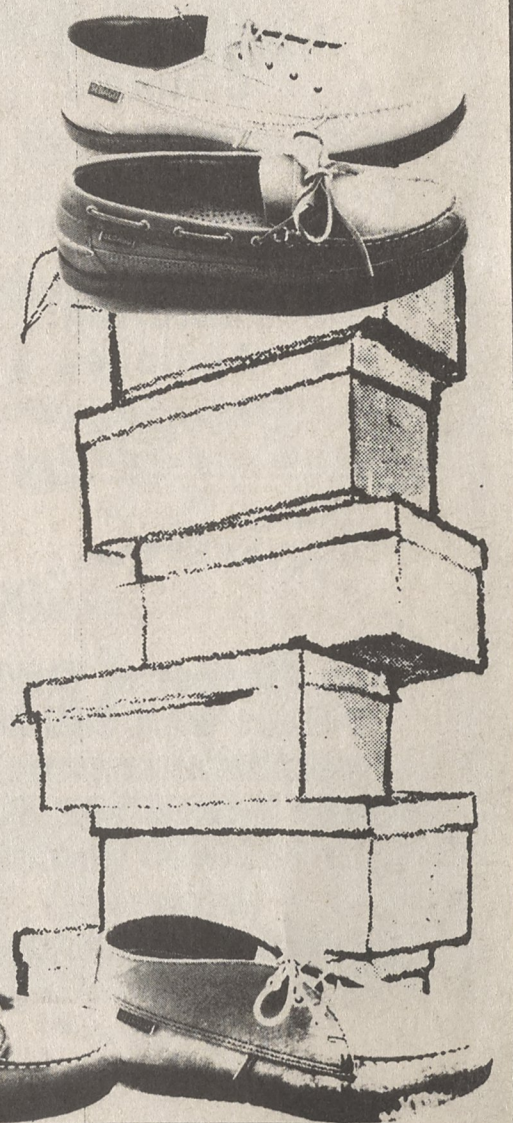

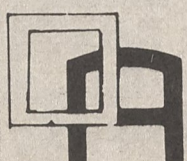
