Grover Receives Hugo Money

The Town of Grover has received \$5193 from the state and federal governments to help pay for Hurricane Hugo cleanup but the City of Kings Mountain, which expects to receive \$450,000, hasn't received reimbursement yet.

"We have been told that our applications have been reviewed and are approved but the processing time will take a little longer," said City Manager George Wood. He said the process takes from two to six weeks once the application is filed.

Monday night Grover commissioners formally au-

thorized Mayor Bill McCarter to sign a Hugo relief acceptance check. McCarter has been working with the Federal Emergency Management Assistance offices in Charlotte which administers the funds.

Checks were delivered to many Gaston municipalities on Monday and also to neighboring Shelby which received \$100,566.

Public assistance payments from Hugo, the worst financial disaster to hit North Carolina in terms of natural disasters this century, are expected to amount to more than \$63 million.

A 3,250 square foot addition to the present Town Hall is expected to be one of the first items of consideration on the new board's agenda. Since the board recently leased the police and fire departments to firemen, a new police station is expected to be included in the proposed addition which would also include a community room for Senior Citizens and other groups plus bathrooms, a kitchen and storage facilities. McCarter said architect's drawings have been completmade available for board study.

Other projects for the new year will include recapping of streets, reseeding and fertilizing of the ball fields and construction of backstops and benches for Brice Harry Memorial Park.

'We will be ready to extend water and sewer lines and will need to talk about annexation some more and one more well is badly needed," said McCarter. Grover buys one-third of its water from Kings

McCarter told the new members that board members earn \$200 a month, emphasizing the word "earn" and stressed the importance of setting the right priorities.

Both newcomers King and Rowland pledged their cooperation and King called for more citizen input. "I'm looking forward to this administration doing a lot of good things for this town.'

In other actions, the new administration reappointed Debora ed and a cost estimate will soon be Philbeck as clerk, McCarter as finance officer and office manager, Commissioner Howell as maintenance supervisor, Commissioner Ronald Queen as Mayor Pro Tem and Glenn Rountree as cemetery




