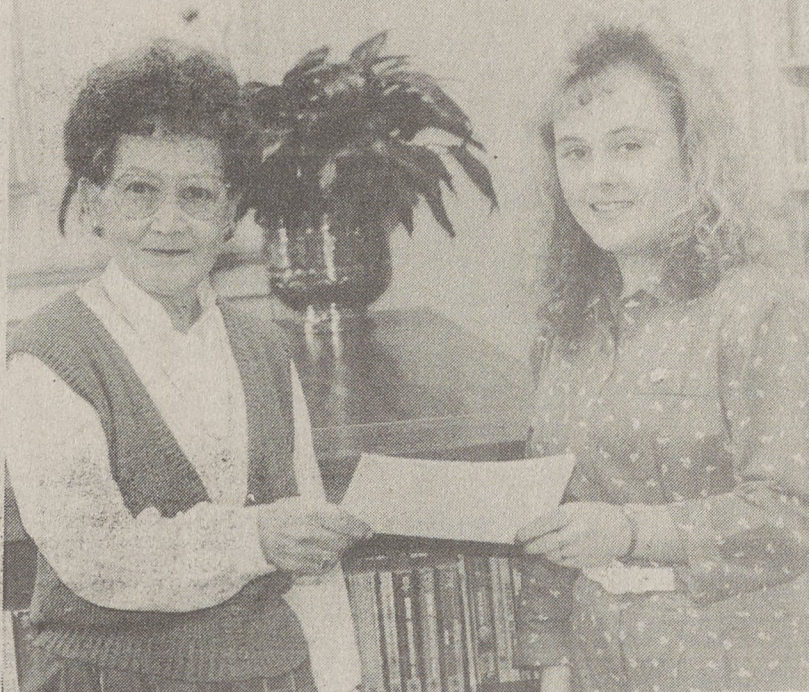

Recycling Site To Be Set Up

A recycling site is expected to be set up by the city on Railroad Avenue across the street from Parkdale Mills.

"We're all for recycling," said Sam Tesenair, spokesman for the mill, "but we want to encourage our neighbors on Meadowbrook Road to use the containers and we want to encourage all who use it to keep it in proper order."

Responding to a letter from Patrick Yarn owner Lawrence Patrick, City Manager George Wood said the mill has a legitimate concern about how the proposed site will be operated. The city will

impose a ban on household garbage being dumped there.

Wood said the city needs to run a recycling site but not if sanitation workers have to sort out the garbage and there is a real problem with enforcement.

"We need to reduce our costs at the landfill and it's in our best interest to run the site but we intend to keep the site free of litter," he said.

The board authorized a written letter of assurance to Patrick regarding the maintenance of the proposed recycling site.

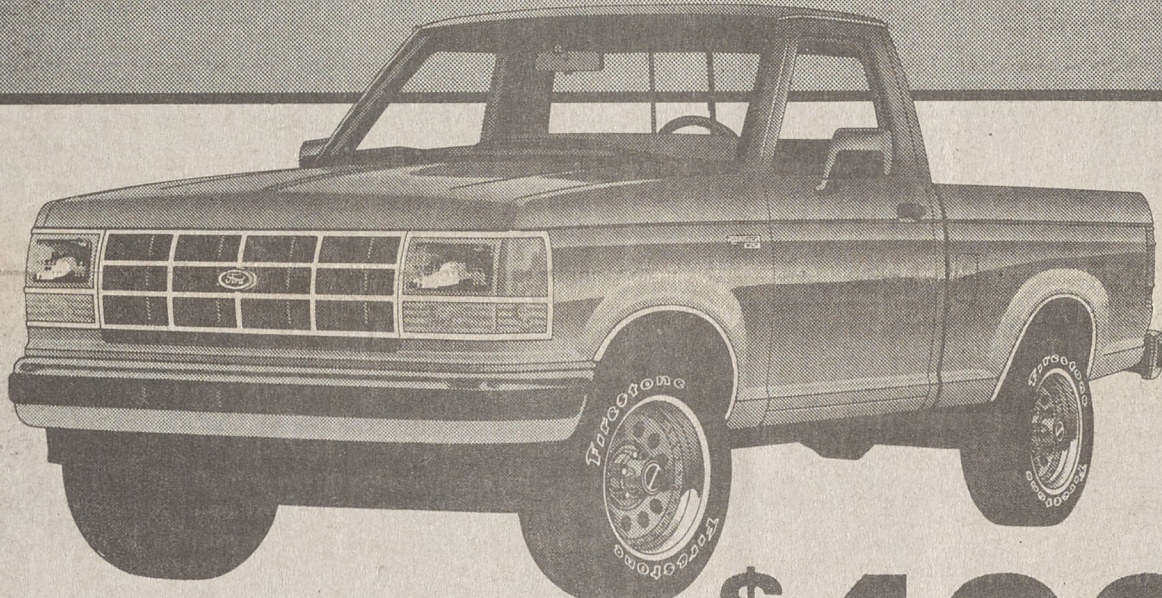

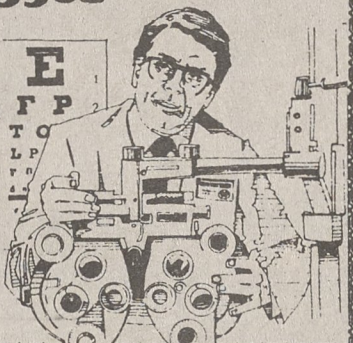
