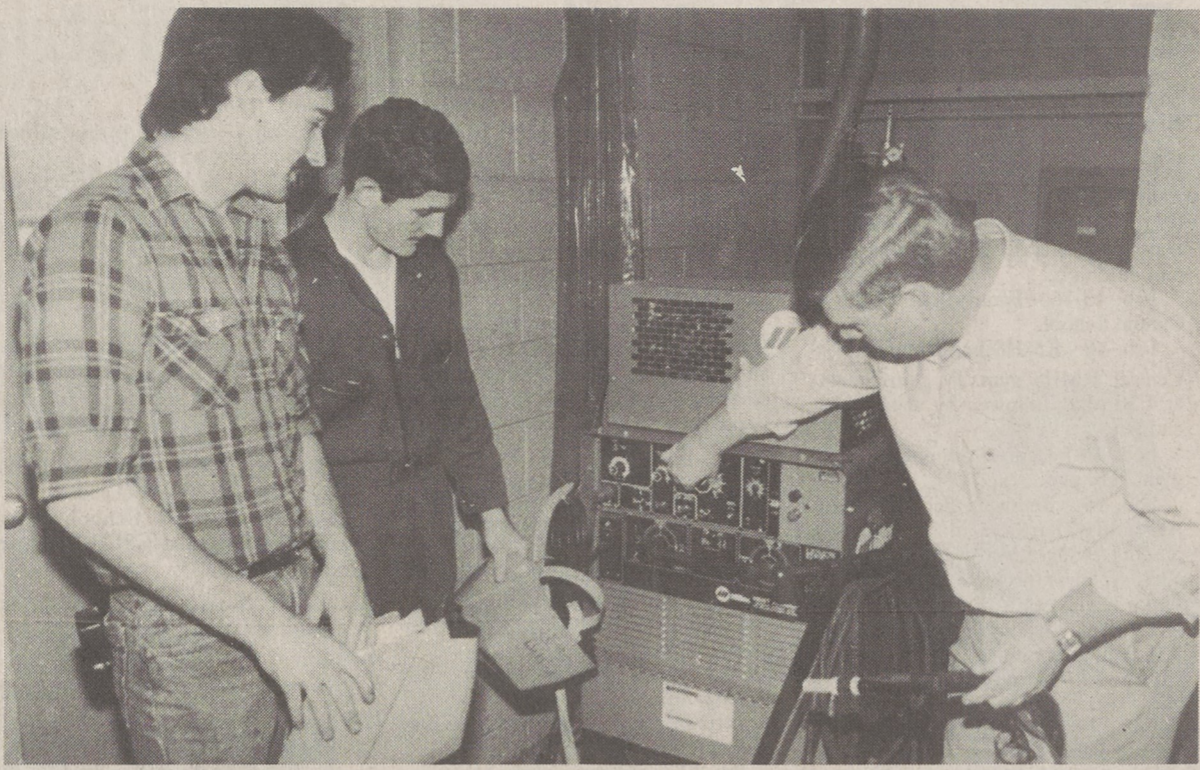


Vocational Ed Week Underway

Vocational educators and students in Kings Mountain as well as across North Carolina and the nation are celebrating Vocational Education Week this week.

The theme, "Vocational Education: It Works," provides a focus for the almost 14 million Americans enrolled in public secondary and post-secondary vocational education programs nationwide. The 1361 students enrolled in vocational education in Kings Mountain will be a part of this celebration.

The celebration will feature student exhibits and displays at the Cleveland Mall February 14, 15, and 16. Each of the Vocational Youth Organizations will honor the teachers in their schools at breakfast and drop-ins. Over thirty representatives from business and industry will be guest speakers in vocational classes. Place mats featuring vocational students in action will be used by local restaurants during the week. Bulletin boards will be displayed by vocational students and staff during the week

council is composed of a group of business, industry, community leaders, and key educators who advise the vocational program re-

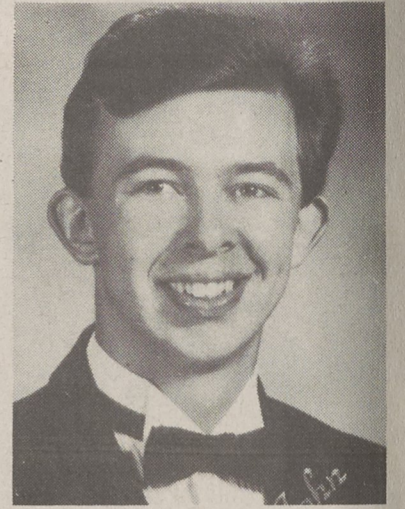
garding programs and procedures. The first in a series of sixteen articles on vocational education will be featured in next week's Herald.
