KM Boys Club Cagers **Win State Tournament**

The Kings Mountain Boys Club 13-year-old AAU all-stars won the state championship last weekend in Concord and will play in the national tournament in July in Indiana.

This marks the third straight year a KMBC team has qualified for the national tournament. KM teams finished second and third in the nation the last two years.

Kings Mountain defeated Gastonia 88-40, Raleigh 95-43 and the Charlotte Royals 88-79 to win the state. Raleigh defeated the Charlotte Royals in overtime for second place and will also advance to the national tournament.


