Admission is \$3 for adults and \$2 for students and senior citizens. For more information call 865-1636.



A black male got out of the car and told me someone wanted to speak to me. I walked over to the vehicle and a black male got out of the car and walked over to me. Then the man produced a small handgun and placed it near my ribs and placed me in the rear of his vehicle at gunpoint," he said. A hood was placed over the victim's

Joseph Y. Maddox, of Fallston, Maddox drove his car out the main head and he was driven to an unknown location, where he was detained and then released in Charlotte.

After his release, Maddox said he got into his own vehicle, which had been driven by one of the robbers to Charlotte, and went to the Charlotte Police Department. When Maddox got into his car to come home, he said he realized that his money was missing.

The kidnaper is described as a black male six feet four inches tall and weighing 210 pounds with bronze, curly hair. Maddox said the kidnaper spoke with a northern ac-




