Mounties Lose To North Gaston In Third Round Of State Playoffs

ond straight state baseball championship ended Wednesday night at Lancaster Field when North Gaston's Wildcats stunned the Mountaineers 5-3 in the Western se-

The win was the third straight playoff victory over a conference championship team for the Wildcats, who finished third in the Southwestern 3-A Conference and had lost four straight games to the Mountaineers.

Kings Mountain finished its season with a 21-4 overall record and had a two-year mark of 44-11.

The Wildcats got a superb pitching performance from senior southpaw Chad Brown, who was a hard luck loser in three previous starts against the Mountaineers. He lost to the Mounties in both regular season SWC contests and in the Gaston Neighbors Tournament. Brown did not pitch in the SWC tournament championship game when KM defeated the Wildcats 12-1.

The Mountaineers out-hit the Wildcats, eight to six, but Brown was in control most of the way. He worked out of a jam without damage in the fifth inning when the Mountaineers put two runners on with only one out and got a gameending double play in the bottom of the seventh after the Mounties scored two runs to cut into a 5-1




