At the end of the program, Nueman taught the children to sit on the floor in the African manner, and to sing a song in two African languages. He also played some African music and showed a short video on some of the African countries. Exhibits around the room displayed various art, artifacts, and products of Africa. Of particular interest were the ebony carvings which included animals, such as elephants, deer, and lions, as well as figures of the king and queen and other people. Mr. Nueman explained that the king wore a necklace of beads. Sometimes the king would wear the beads over his mouth for weeks at a time, but when he wore the necklace down around his neck, he would go out of the palace and talk to the people.

Other items in the display included beautiful table mats woven of raffia or banana stalks, as well as a wooden bowl and a fork and spoon, and a woven jewelry box.

On the walls were hung some samples of cotton fabric which were exported from Africa.

Graded programs will continue throughout the summer and the children will have a chance to read and learn more about that unique continent on the other side of the world. Nueman will also conduct an adult program about Africa on Thursday, July 26, at 6 p.m.




