CAROLINE HARPER

A one-car wreck in Asheboro Friday night claimed the lives of two young people, including a former Kings Mountain woman.

Cynthia Caroline Harper, 24, daughter of Ragan Harper of Kings Mountain and Diane Fite Bailey of Belmont, and Philip Ronald Craven II, 23, both of Asheboro, died in the wreckage of Craven's 1989 Mazda which ran off the left side of a road in a sharp curve, came back across Spero Road and ran off the right side of the road and struck a utility pole, according to Trooper W. I. Eckard. The accident occurred at 11:30 p.m. 8 mile west of Asheboro city limits on Rural Paved Road 1504, a short distance from the Craven home.

Funeral services for Miss Harper were held Monday morning at 11 a.m. at Kings Mountain's First Presbyterian Church, of which she was a member. Dr. Eric Faust was assisted by Rev. Gary Bryant and Rev. David Smith in officiating the service, and interment was in Gaston Memorial Park.

Funeral services for Craven were held also on Monday at Asheboro's First United Methodist

Church, of which he was a member. A 1989 graduate of N. C. State University, he was in the real estate business with his father. He is survived by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Philip Craven Jr., a brother and a sister.

A Kings Mountain native, Miss Harper was a graduate of Kings Mountain Senior High School and a graduate of UNC at Chapel Hill. She was employed as a travel agent at Howard & Short Travel Co. in Asheboro.

Also surviving, in addition to her parents, are her sister, Katherine Harper of Belmont; her grandmother, Mrs. Gladys Fite of Belmont; and her step-sister, Mrs. Jamie Lakey of Kings Mountain.

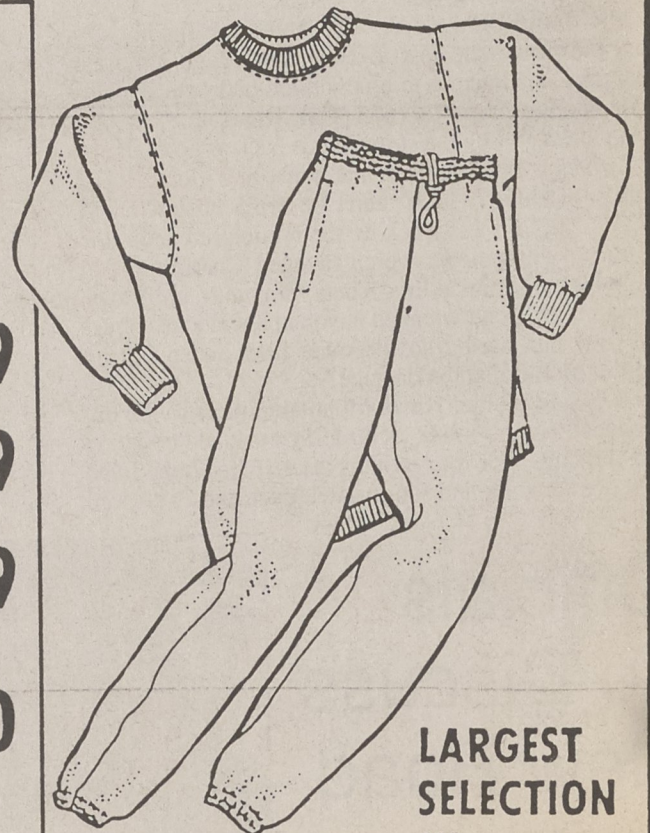

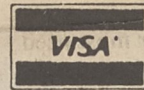

Kings Mountain Police arrested Patheriaco Joe McClain, 38, of 218 Parrish Drive, on Tuesday and charged him with one felonious count of burning an uninhabited dwelling and one count felonious count of second degree arson.

Arresting officers were Det. Sgt. James Camp and Ptl. Melvin Procter.

Kathy Tallent, her two-year-old son, Brandon and eight-year-old daughter, Kristin, were burned out of their home after fire swept through a four-unit apartment com-

plex Friday morning at Wilson Terrace on Lackey Street.

When firemen arrived at 6:30 a.m. they found the top portion of the four unit complex engulfed in flames.

Apparently starting in the middle unit, the fire quickly spread to the other three apartments, which were being renovated and vacant at the time of the fire.

Water Decision Due On Tuesday

City Council is expected to take action Tuesday on recommendations by the city utilities committee about what to do about cost overruns in the water bonds project and spillway improvements at Moss Lake.

The September meeting is at 7:30 p.m. at the Governmental Facilities Building.

Members of the Utilities committee looked at several options Wednesday night to cut down some of the expense of the water project, which is over a half million dollars more than budgeted in bond monies.

City Manager George Wood said Council will also consider three utility contracts, including one with Duke Power Company to change loads and delivery points on the proposed sub-station on Gaston Street.

The board will also choose a delegate and alternate to the annual meeting Oct. 22 of the N. C. League of Municipalities and consider a resolution supporting Public Power Week.
