Elliott souvenir items have been missing, for the most part, during the 1990 Winston Cup season with the domination of General Motors cars and Dale Earnhardt.

Mark Martin and Geoff Bodine have had victories for Ford, but not all Elliott fans are Ford fans.

Earnhardt in 1990 has amassed a group of loyal fans like nobody since Elliott of 1985 or Richard Petty of old. The remaining race fans have had to eat a lot of Earnhardt crow.
