Before-Care and After-School Care is offered to working parents for their children at each of the elementary schools and this fall for the first time the program will expand to Grover, where Before-Care service will begin at 5:30 a.m. At the other schools, Before-Care starts at 6:30 a.m. After-Care, which includes tutoring homework, art and supervised play, continues when school dismisses until 6 p.m. Cost of the service is \$22.50 if the child is at school until 6 p.m. and \$15.00 if the child is there until 4:30 p.m. Six people are employed in this program and an outing is held at end of school. Nutritional snacks are included.

Sixty K-5 students enjoyed arts, ceramics, math and computer science in the Summer Enrichment program at Bethware School which enrolled 60 children.


