

Renovations Underway At Police Department

is getting a facelift.

Workmen have been on the scene this week installing Carolina blue tile in the halls and offices and doing other interior refurbishing. Next on the agenda is trimming the roof, repairing the windows and replacing dental moldings and soffit and replacing the woodwork in the gable area. The outside of the building is still to be painted. Replacing the deteriorated wood on the soffit and front gable, replacing and repairing flooring, patching ceilings and walls in squad rooms, and repair work on guttering are all proposed improvements. Estimated cost of the renovations is \$25,000.
