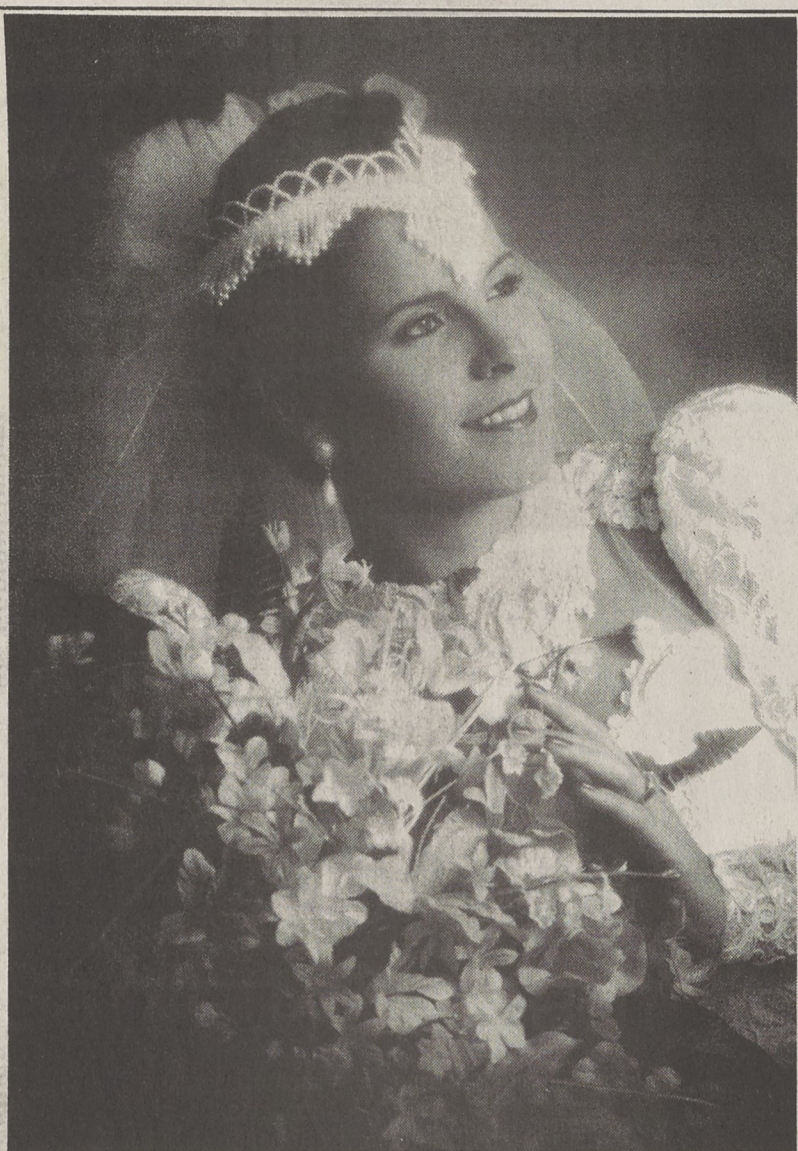


Weddings
