Hicks said the performance by Williams, who played every play on offense and defense, was as good an all-around effort as he's had out of a player since he's been coaching here. He made nine tackles on defense, including two for losses, and had over 200 kick return yards, plus another return of 90 yards which was called back because of a controversial clipping call.

"He had just an unbelievable game," he said. "They tried to pick on him by putting that big old number 8 (Hush) out as a slot, and tried to throw underneath him and tried to block him with the real big guys. But he did a heck of a job. That's one of the most total individual efforts I've seen in a long time."

Hicks also praised the running performance of Lockhart, who ran hard and was the leading rusher against a Burns defense which was designed especially to stop him after his two outstanding performances in KM wins over Burns last year.

"He broke the big play that kept us in the ballgame," Hicks said, referring to a 53-yard burst up the middle which set up a two-yard TD run by Victor Bell which gave KM a 13-10 lead early in the fourth quarter. "That was really the only touchdown which was set up by our offense."
